## House Bill 2338

Sponsored by Representative GREENLICK, Senator STEINER HAYWARD (Presession filed.)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Creates Task Force on Extending the Westside Express Service Commuter Line to Salem. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

1	A BILL FOR AN ACT
2	Relating to the Task Force on Extending the Westside Express Service Commuter Line to Salem;
3	and declaring an emergency.
4	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
5	SECTION 1. (1) The Task Force on Extending the Westside Express Service Commuter
6	Line to Salem is established, consisting of 17 members appointed as follows:
7	(a) The Governor shall appoint:
8	(A) One member who is the Representative of the Fifth Congressional District of Oregon
9	or the Representative's designee.
10	(B) One member who is the mayor of Beaverton or the designee of the mayor of
11	Beaverton.
12	(C) One member who is the mayor of Wilsonville or the designee of the mayor of
13	Wilsonville.
14	(D) One member who is the mayor of Keizer or the designee of the mayor of Keizer.
15	(E) One member who is the mayor of Salem or the designee of the mayor of Salem.
16	(F) One member who is a representative of Salem-Keizer Transit, and who shall be
17	nominated by the Board of Directors of Salem-Keizer Transit.
18	(G) One member who is the mayor of Donald or the designee of the mayor of Donald.
19	(H) One member who is the mayor of Woodburn or the designee of the mayor of
20	Woodburn.
21	(I) One member who is a representative of Tri-Met, as defined in ORS 267.334.
22	(J) One member who is a representative of Washington County government.
23	(K) One member who is a representative of Marion County government.
24	(b) Two members of the Senate, one of whom is a Democrat and one of whom is a Re-
25	publican, who shall be appointed by the President of the Senate.
26	(c) Two members of the House of Representatives, one of whom is a Democrat and one
27	of whom is a Republican, who shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Represen-
28	tatives.
29	(d) The Director of Transportation shall appoint:
30	(A) One member who represents the Portland and Western Railroad, and who shall be
31	appointed by the Director of Transportation from a list of persons submitted to the Depart-

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1	ment of Transportation by the Portland and Western Railroad.
2	(B) One member who is the administrator of the rail division of the department.
3	(2) The task force shall:
4	(a) Explore the possibility of extending the Westside Express Service commuter line from
5	Wilsonville to Salem; and
6	(b) Develop and implement a program designed to generate interest and activity in ex-
7	tending the commuter line.
8	(3) The task force may:
9	(a) Identify the actions that are necessary to extend the Westside Express Service
10	commuter line to Salem;
11	(b) Research the need for an extension of the Westside Express Service commuter line;
12	and
13	(c) Evaluate the results of the research described in paragraphs (a) and (b) of this sub-
14	section.
15	(4) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the
16	transaction of business.
17	(5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the voting
18	members of the task force.
19	(6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.
20	(7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appoint-
21	ment to become immediately effective.
22	(8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson
23	or of a majority of the voting members of the task force.
24	(9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.
25	(10) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and
26	may include recommendations for legislation, to the interim committees of the Legislative
27	Assembly related to transportation no later than October 1, 2014.
28	(11) The Legislative Administration Committee shall provide staff support to the task
29	force.
30	(12) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are not
31	entitled to compensation, but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary travel and other
32	expenses incurred by them in the performance of their official duties in the manner and
33	amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. Claims for expenses incurred in performing functions
34	of the task force shall be paid out of funds appropriated to Legislative Administration Com-
35	mittee for purposes of the task force.
36	(13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist
37	the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating
38	to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force
39	consider necessary to perform their duties.
40	(14) The task force shall have its first meeting no later than 60 days after the effective
41	date of this 2013 Act.
42	SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2013 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the 2015
43	regular session of the Legislative Assembly as specified in ORS 171.010.
44	SECTION 3. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate a preservation of the public
45	peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect
