Section 21, chapter 37, Oregon Laws 2012, is amended to read: 4 "Sec. 21. (1) The Youth Development Council is established. The council shall function under 5 the direction and control of the Oregon Education Investment Board established by section 1, 6 7 chapter 519, Oregon Laws 2011. 8 "(2) The council is established for the purpose of assisting the board in overseeing a unified 9 system that provides services to school-age children through youth 20 years of age in a manner that 10 supports academic success, reduces criminal involvement and is integrated, measurable and ac-11 countable. 12"(3) The council consists of no fewer than 15 members who are appointed by the Governor. The 13 Governor shall ensure that membership of the council satisfies any federal requirements for mem-14 bership of a state advisory committee on juvenile justice[,] and shall include a minimum of three 15representatives of county departments and boards of county commissioners from diverse 16 regions of this state and tribal representation in the membership of the council. "[(6) In accordance with applicable provisions of ORS chapter 183, the council may adopt rules 2829 necessary for the administration of the laws that the council is charged with administering.]

30 "(8) The council shall adopt rules to implement the provisions of this section. Rules adopted by the council must, at a minimum, establish demonstrated outcomes and strategic 31objectives for community-based youth development programs, services and initiatives that 3233 receive funding pursuant to this section.

"(9) As used in this section, 'county department' means an office designated by the 34county governing body as defined in ORS 357.216 to perform specific duties and functions. 35

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"SECTION 3. Section 26, chapter 37, Oregon Laws 2012, is amended to read:

"Sec. 26. By November 1, 2013, the Youth Development Council shall submit a report to the 37 38 Oregon Education Investment Board that establishes funding priorities for [gang violence intervention efforts and programs that assist gang-affected youth.]: 39

40 "(1) The prevention of and intervention in the risk factors that lead to juvenile delin-41 quency, including funding priorities for community-based youth development programs, services and initiatives with demonstrated outcomes and strategic objectives; and 42

43 "(2) Gang violence prevention and intervention efforts and services that assist gang-44 involved youth.

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"SECTION 4. (1) The equitable formula for the distribution of funding identified in section

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1 21 (4)(a), chapter 37, Oregon Laws 2012, as amended by section 1 of this 2013 Act, must be 2 established no later than June 30, 2013.

"(2) The Youth Development Council shall enter into performance-based intergovernmental agreements with regional and county entities, and tribal governments, as required by section 21 (4)(d), chapter 37, Oregon Laws 2012, as amended by section 1 of this 2013 Act, by September 1, 2013. The youth development programs, services and initiatives that are to be provided pursuant to such agreements under section 21 (4)(d), chapter 37, Oregon Laws 2012, as amended by section 1 of this 2013 Act, must be provided by September 30, 2013.

9 "SECTION 5. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
10 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect
11 on its passage.".

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
