

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2406

By COMMITTEE ON TRANSPORTATION AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

1 Delete lines 4 through 27 of the printed bill and insert:

2 “**SECTION 1.** ORS 815.220 is amended to read:

3 “815.220. (1) A person commits the offense of obstruction of vehicle windows if the person drives
4 or moves on any highway or owns and causes or knowingly permits to be driven or moved on any
5 highway any vehicle with windows obstructed in a manner prohibited under this section.

6 “(2) The windows of a vehicle are obstructed in a manner prohibited by this section if any ma-
7 terial that [*prohibits*] **prevents** or impairs the ability to see into or out of the vehicle is upon any
8 vehicle window described in this subsection. This subsection applies to any sign, poster, one-way
9 glass, adhesive film, glaze application or other material if the material [*prohibits*] **prevents** or im-
10 pairs the ability to see into or out of the vehicle. This subsection only applies to the following
11 windows of the vehicle:

12 “(a) The front windshield.

13 “(b) The side-wings.

14 “(c) The side windows on either side forward of or adjacent to the operator’s seat.

15 “[*d*] *The rear window.*]

16 “(3) Nothing in this section prohibits safety glazing materials of a type that conforms to stan-
17 dards established under ORS 815.040.

18 “(4) Nothing in this section prohibits placement of permits in accordance with the provisions
19 of ORS 803.650 or with rules adopted by the Department of Transportation under ORS 803.650.

20 “(5) Nothing in this section prohibits the application of tinting material to the windows of a
21 motor vehicle in compliance with ORS 815.221.

22 “(6) The offense described in this section, obstruction of vehicle windows, is a Class D traffic
23 violation.”.
