## House Bill 2414

Sponsored by Representative CAMERON; Representatives BERGER, GILLIAM, Senator WINTERS (Presession filed.)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Permits Director of Transportation to authorize third party service providers to perform certain transactions currently performed by Department of Transportation.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to Department of Transportation authorized service providers.
- Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- SECTION 1. (1) The Director of Transportation may authorize third party service providers to perform certain transactions related to vehicle titles, vehicle registrations, vehicle registration plates, driver licenses, driver permits, identification cards and vehicle dealer certificates. A service provider may provide services electronically through the Internet. Service providers must meet all requirements established by the director relating to security, the types of transactions that the service provider may offer and payment options available through the service provider.
- (2) Notwithstanding ORS 192.410 to 192.505 or other law, the director may furnish all documents to an authorized service provider necessary to allow the service provider to perform the transactions identified by the director.
- (3) An authorized service provider shall submit to the Department of Transportation all statutorily prescribed fees and taxes the service provider collects. In addition to the statutorily prescribed fees and taxes, a service provider may charge a service fee of \$\_\_\_\_\_ for each transaction performed by the service provider.
- (4) The director may authorize an authorized service provider who provides services electronically through the Internet to process electronic fund transfers to the department for payment of amounts collected by the service provider. The service provider may add a \$\_\_\_\_\_\_ service fee for each electronic funds transfer.
- (5) An authorized service provider must post a fee schedule in a conspicuous location in each facility operated by the service provider and on every website maintained by the service provider. The fee schedule must list the amount charged for each transaction performed by the service provider and the amount charged by the department for the same transaction.
