House Bill 2506

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Presession filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Revenue)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Establishes Task Force on School Funding. Sunsets task force on date of convening of 2015 regular session of Legislative Assembly. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to school funding; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Task Force on School Funding is established.

5 (2) The task force consists of 13 members appointed as follows:

6 (a) The President of the Senate shall appoint two members from among members of the

7 Senate.

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- 8 (b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint two members from among
 9 members of the House of Representatives.
- (c) The Governor shall appoint nine members who represent school districts, education
 service districts, community colleges and public universities.

(3) The task force shall make recommendations regarding possible modifications to the
 funding formulas used to distribute State School Fund moneys to school districts, education
 service districts, community colleges and public universities.

15 (4) When making the recommendations described in subsection (3) of this section, the 16 task force must consider how proposed modifications to funding formulas align with the 17 policies established by the Oregon Education Investment Board and with the state goals for 18 high school graduation and post-secondary education rates expressed in ORS 351.009.

19 (5) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the 20 transaction of business.

(6) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the voting
 members of the task force.

23 (7) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.

(8) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appoint ment to become immediately effective.

(9) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson
 or of a majority of the voting members of the task force.

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(10) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.

(11) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to the interim committees of the Legislative

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1 Assembly related to education no than October 1, 2014.

2 (12) The office of the Governor shall provide staff support to the task force.

3 (13) Notwithstanding ORS 171.072, members of the task force who are members of the 4 Legislative Assembly are not entitled to mileage expenses or a per diem and serve as volun-5 teers on the task force. Other members of the task force are not entitled to compensation 6 or reimbursement for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task force.

7 (14) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist 8 the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating 9 to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force 10 consider necessary to perform their duties.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2013 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the 2015
 regular session of the Legislative Assembly as specified in ORS 171.010.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect
 on its passage.

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
