# **A-Engrossed** House Bill 2524

#### SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure

Limits exemption from construction contractor licensing requirement for financial institutions, subsidiaries, real estate [personnel] managers and suppliers of workers. Increases maximum amount for exempt work of casual, minor or inconsequential nature.

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#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to construction contractor licensing exemptions; creating new provisions; and amending 3

ORS 701.010.

#### Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4

SECTION 1. ORS 701.010 is amended to read:

6 701.010. The Construction Contractors Board may adopt rules to make licensure optional for persons who offer, bid or undertake to perform work peripheral to construction, as defined by ad-7 ministrative rule of the board. The following persons are exempt from licensure under this chapter: 8 9

- (1) A person who is constructing, altering, improving or repairing personal property.
- 10 (2) A person who is constructing, altering, improving or repairing a structure located within the boundaries of any site or reservation under the jurisdiction of the federal government. 11

12(3) A person who furnishes materials, supplies, equipment or finished product and does not fab-13 ricate them into, or consume them, in the performance of the work of a contractor.

(4) A person working on one structure or project, under one or more contracts, when the ag-14 15 gregate price of all of that person's contracts for labor, materials and all other items is less than [\$500] \$1,000 and such work is of a casual, minor or inconsequential nature. This subsection does 16 not apply to a person who advertises or puts out any sign or card or other device that might indi-17 cate to the public that the person is a contractor. 18

(5) An owner who contracts for work to be performed by a licensed contractor. This subsection 19 does not apply to a person who, in the pursuit of an independent business, constructs, remodels, 2021repairs or for compensation and with the intent to sell the structure, arranges to have constructed, 22remodeled or repaired a structure with the intent of offering the structure for sale before, upon or after completion. It is prima facie evidence that there was an intent of offering the structure for sale 2324 if the person who constructed, remodeled or repaired the structure or arranged to have the structure constructed, remodeled or repaired does not occupy the structure after its completion. 25

(6) An owner who contracts for one or more licensed contractors to perform work wholly or 2627partially within the same calendar year on not more than three existing residential structures of the 28 owner. This subsection does not apply to an owner contracting for work that requires a building

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permit unless the work that requires a permit is performed by, or under the direction of, a residen-1 2 tial general contractor. (7) A person performing work on a property that person owns or performing work as the owner's 3 employee, whether the property is occupied by the owner or not, or a person performing work on 4 that person's residence, whether or not that person owns the residence. This subsection does not 5 apply to a person performing work on a structure owned by that person or the owner's employee, 6 if the work is performed in the pursuit of an independent business with the intent of offering the 7 structure for sale before, upon or after completion. 8 9 (8) A person licensed or registered in one of the following trades or professions when operating within the scope of that license or registration: 10 (a) An architect [licensed] registered by the State Board of Architect Examiners. 11 12(b) A professional engineer registered by the State Board of Examiners for Engineering and 13 Land Surveying. (c) A water well contractor licensed by the Water Resources Department. 14 15 (d) A sewage disposal system installer licensed by the Department of Environmental Quality. (e) A landscape contracting business licensed under ORS 671.510 to 671.760. 16 (f) A pesticide operator licensed under ORS 634.116 who does not conduct inspections for wood 17 destroying organisms for the transfer of real estate. 18 19 (g) An appraiser certified or licensed under ORS chapter 674 or an appraiser assistant registered 20under ORS chapter 674 by the Appraiser Certification and Licensure Board. (9) A landscape contracting business operating within the scope of a license issued under ORS 2122671.510 to 671.760 that: 23(a) Constructs fences, decks, arbors, patios, landscape edging, driveways, walkways or retaining walls and meets the applicable bonding requirements under ORS 671.690; or 2425(b) Subcontracts to a licensed plumbing contractor, or otherwise arranges for a licensed plumbing contractor to perform, the installation of an irrigation system described in ORS 671.540 (1)(m) 2627or the repair or maintenance of an irrigation system. (10) A person who performs work subject to this chapter as an employee of a contractor. 28(11) A manufacturer of a manufactured home constructed under standards established by the 2930 federal government. 31 (12) A person involved in the movement of: 32(a) Modular buildings or structures other than manufactured structures not in excess of 14 feet in width. 33 34 (b) Structures not in excess of 16 feet in width when the structures are being moved by their 35 owner if the owner is not a contractor required to be licensed under this chapter. (13) A commercial lending institution, commercial lending institution subsidiary or surety 36 37 company that arranges for [the] completion, repair or remodeling by one or more licensed con-38 tractors of a structure in which the institution, subsidiary or company holds a legal or security interest. As used in this subsection, "commercial lending institution" means any bank, 39 mortgage banking company, trust company, savings bank, savings and loan association, credit union, 40 national banking association, federal savings and loan association, insurance company or federal 41 42credit union maintaining an office in this state. (14) A real estate licensee who engages in the management of rental real estate as defined 43

in ORS 696.010 or the employee of that licensee when performing work on a structure that the realestate licensee manages under a contract.

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1 (15) Units of government other than those specified in ORS 701.005 (5)(c) and (d).

2 (16) A qualified intermediary in a property exchange that qualifies under section 1031 of the 3 Internal Revenue Code as amended and in effect on January 1, 2004, if the qualified intermediary 4 is not performing construction activities.

5 (17) A [business] worker leasing company or temporary service provider, both as defined 6 in ORS 656.850, that supplies personnel to a licensed contractor for the performance of work under 7 the direction and supervision of the contractor.

8 (18) City or county inspectors acting under ORS 701.225 or inspectors described in ORS 455.715.

9 (19) A person performing work for purposes of agricultural drainage, agricultural trenching or

10 agricultural irrigation or involving the construction of agricultural fences to control livestock.

(20) A person performing work that is subject to ORS 527.610 to 527.770 on forestlands for which
notice of operation has been filed under ORS 527.670.
