## House Bill 2624

Sponsored by Representative CLEM (at the request of Oregon Outdoor Council) (Presession filed.)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Provides that county is exempt from applicability of statute banning use of dogs to hunt black bears or cougars and use of bait to hunt black bears if voters approve county measure proposed by initiative petition or referred to people by governing body of county.

4	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
5	SECTION 1. (1) A county is exempt from the applicability of ORS 498.164 if a county
6	measure is approved that exempts the county from the applicability of ORS 498.164. The
7	measure may be proposed by initiative petition, or referred to the people by the governing
8	body of the county, at an election held on a date specified in ORS 203.085 (1).
9	(2) A county that is exempt from the applicability of ORS 498.164 pursuant to subsection
10	(1) of this section shall notify the State Department of Fish and Wildlife.
