

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2640

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 5 through 29 and delete pages 2 and 3 and insert:

2 “**SECTION 1.** Section 1, chapter 519, Oregon Laws 2011, as amended by section 8, chapter 519,
3 Oregon Laws 2011, and section 20, chapter 36, Oregon Laws 2012, is amended to read:

4 “**Sec. 1.** (1) The Oregon Education Investment Board is established for the purpose of ensuring
5 that all public school students in this state reach the education outcomes established for the state.
6 The board shall accomplish this goal by overseeing a unified public education system that begins
7 with early childhood services and continues throughout public education from kindergarten to
8 post-secondary education.

9 “(2)(a) The board consists of [~~13~~] **15** members as follows:

10 “(A) The Governor, or the designee of the Governor; and

11 “(B) [~~Twelve~~] **Fourteen** members who are appointed by the Governor, subject to confirmation
12 by the Senate in the manner provided in ORS 171.562 and 171.565, and who serve at the pleasure
13 of the Governor.

14 “(b) When determining who to appoint to the board, the Governor shall:

15 “(A) Ensure that each congressional district of this state is represented by at least one member
16 of the board; [~~and~~]

17 “**(B) Consult with the oldest nonprofit network of parents in Oregon that provides**
18 **statewide representation of parents to select one member who is a parent of a student in a**
19 **public school in this state in any grade from kindergarten through grade 12;**

20 “**(C) Consult with an organization that represents school district boards in this state to**
21 **select one member of a school district board; and**

22 “[~~(B)~~] **(D)** Solicit recommendations from:

23 “**(i)** The Speaker of the House of Representatives for at least two members [~~and from~~]; **and**

24 “**(ii)** The President of the Senate for at least two members.

25 “(3) The Governor, or the Governor’s designee, shall serve as chairperson of the Oregon Edu-
26 cation Investment Board.

27 “(4) The duties of the board include:

28 “(a) Ensuring that early childhood services are streamlined and connected to public education
29 from kindergarten through grade 12 and that public education from kindergarten through grade 12
30 is streamlined and connected to post-secondary education. To assist the board in fulfilling this duty,
31 the board shall oversee:

32 “(A) The Early Learning Council established by section 4, chapter 519, Oregon Laws 2011.

33 “(B) The Higher Education Coordinating Commission established by ORS 351.715.

34 “(b) Recommending strategic investments in order to ensure that the public education budget is
35 integrated and is targeted to achieve the education outcomes established for the state.

1 “(c) Providing an integrated, statewide, student-based data system that monitors expenditures
2 and outcomes to determine the return on statewide education investments. The board shall provide
3 the data system described in this paragraph by:

4 “(A) Developing the data system or identifying or modifying an existing data system that ac-
5 complishes the goals of the data system; and

6 “(B) Ensuring that the data system is maintained.

7 “(d) Entering into achievement compacts and administering sections 14, 15 and 18, **chapter 36,**
8 **Oregon Laws 2012** [of this 2012 Act].

9 “(e) Working with the Quality Education Commission to identify best practices for school dis-
10 tricts and the costs and benefits of the adoption of those best practices by school districts.

11 “(5) An appointed member of the board is entitled to compensation and expenses as provided in
12 ORS 292.495.

13 “(6) A majority of the members of the board constitutes a quorum for the transaction of busi-
14 ness.

15 “(7) The board shall meet at such times and places specified by the call of the chairperson or
16 of a majority of the members of the board.

17 “(8) In accordance with applicable provisions of ORS chapter 183, the board may adopt rules
