SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Adds one member to Oregon Education Investment Board as representative of oldest nonprofit network of parents in Oregon that provides statewide representation of parents. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 <u>SECTION 1.</u> Section 1, chapter 519, Oregon Laws 2011, as amended by section 8, chapter 519,
 6 Oregon Laws 2011, and section 20, chapter 36, Oregon Laws 2012, is amended to read:

7 Sec. 1. (1) The Oregon Education Investment Board is established for the purpose of ensuring

8 that all public school students in this state reach the education outcomes established for the state.
9 The board shall accomplish this goal by overseeing a unified public education system that begins

10 with early childhood services and continues throughout public education from kindergarten to

11 post-secondary education.

12 (2)(a) The board consists of [13] 14 members as follows:

13 (A) The Governor, or the designee of the Governor; and

14 (B) [*Twelve*] **Thirteen** members who are appointed by the Governor, subject to confirmation by 15 the Senate in the manner provided in ORS 171.562 and 171.565, and who serve at the pleasure of the

16 Governor.

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17 (b) When determining who to appoint to the board, the Governor shall:

(A) Ensure that each congressional district of this state is represented by at least one memberof the board; [and]

(B) Ensure that one member represents the oldest nonprofit network of parents in Oregon that provides statewide representation of parents; and

[(B)] (C) Solicit recommendations from the Speaker of the House of Representatives for at least two members and from the President of the Senate for at least two members.

(3) The Governor, or the Governor's designee, shall serve as chairperson of the Oregon Educa-tion Investment Board.

(a) Ensuring that early childhood services are streamlined and connected to public education
from kindergarten through grade 12 and that public education from kindergarten through grade 12
is streamlined and connected to post-secondary education. To assist the board in fulfilling this duty,

(d) Entering into achievement compacts and administering sections 14, 15 and 18, chapter 36, Oregon Laws 2012 [of this 2012 Act]. (e) Working with the Quality Education Commission to identify best practices for school districts and the costs and benefits of the adoption of those best practices by school districts. (5) An appointed member of the board is entitled to compensation and expenses as provided in ORS 292.495. (6) A majority of the members of the board constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business. (7) The board shall meet at such times and places specified by the call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the board. (8) In accordance with applicable provisions of ORS chapter 183, the board may adopt rules necessary for the administration of the laws that the board is charged with administering, including any rules necessary for the oversight of the direction and control of the Higher Education Coordinating Commission. **SECTION 2.** Section 1, chapter 519, Oregon Laws 2011, as amended by section 8, chapter 519, Oregon Laws 2011, and sections 20 and 21, chapter 36, Oregon Laws 2012, is amended to read: Sec. 1. (7) The board shall meet at such times and places specified by the call of the chairperson or ofa majority of the members of the board.

(8) In accordance with applicable provisions of ORS chapter 183, the board may adopt rules
necessary for the administration of the laws that the board is charged with administering, including
any rules necessary for the oversight of the direction and control of the Higher Education Coordinating Commission.

27 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 28 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect 29 on its passage.

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
