House Bill 2661

Sponsored by Representative FREDERICK (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to study and report on racial, ethnic and economic disparities in citizen interactions with police officers and on recruitment and retention of minorities by certain institutions related to law enforcement.

Sunsets January 2, 2015.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to police officer interactions with the public; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Oregon Criminal Justice Commission shall conduct a study and 5 evaluation of the following:

6 (a) Disparities in race, ethnicity and economic status of persons stopped, arrested and 7 subjected to the use of force by police officers;

8 (b) The effect of race, ethnicity and economic status on interactions not related to crime
9 between police officers and members of the public; and

(c) Recruitment and retention of minorities by law enforcement agencies, district attor ney offices, the Department of Corrections and the Oregon Youth Authority and their re spective institutions and facilities.

(2) The commission shall report the results of the study to the interim committees of the
 Legislative Assembly related to crime and general government on or before November 1,
 2014.

16 SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2013 Act is repealed on January 2, 2015.

17 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 18 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect 19 on its passage.
