House Bill 2744

Sponsored by Representatives GELSER, WITT

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Requires qualified nonprofit agency for individuals with disabilities to pay minimum wage or prevailing rate of wage set forth in state or federal law to individuals with disabilities. Requires Oregon Department of Administrative Services to verify that qualified nonprofit agency for individuals with disabilities pays minimum wage or prevailing rate of wage. Becomes operative on January 1, 2014.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

5 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. ORS 279.835 is amended to read: 6

- 7 279.835. As used in ORS 279.835 to 279.855:
- 8 [(1) "Department" means the Oregon Department of Administrative Services.]

[(2)] (1)(a) "Direct labor" [includes all] means work required for preparation, processing and 9 10 packing[,].

(b) "Direct labor" does not include [but not] supervision, administration, inspection [and] or 11 12 shipping.

[(3)] (2) "Individual with a disability" means an individual who, because of the nature of the 13 individual's disabilities, is not able to participate fully in competitive employment[,] and for whom 14 15specialized employment opportunities must be provided.

[(4)] (3) "Public agency" [or "public contracting agency"] means [any] an agency of the State 16 of Oregon or [any] a political subdivision [thereof] of the State of Oregon that is authorized by law 17to enter into a public contract or a [contracts and any] public body that is created by intergov-18 19 ernmental agreement.

[(5)] (4) "Qualified nonprofit agency for individuals with disabilities" means a nonprofit activity 20 center or rehabilitation facility that: 21

22(a) Is organized under the laws of the United States or of this state and is operated in the in-23terest of individuals with disabilities, [and] the net income of which does not inure in whole or in 24 part to the benefit of [any] **a** shareholder or other individual;

25(b) [That] Complies with [any] applicable occupational health and safety [standard required by] 26 standards that the laws of the United States or of this state require; [and]

27(c) Pays individuals with disabilities the minimum wage set forth in state or federal law 28 or the prevailing rate of wage set forth in state or federal law if the individual is employed 29 on a project for public works, as defined in ORS 279C.800; and

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[(c)] (d) [That in the manufacture of products and in the provision of services] Employs individ-1 2 uals with disabilities for not less than 75 percent of the work hours of direct labor necessary during each fiscal year to manufacture products or provide services, whether or not the pro-3 ducts or services are procured under ORS 279.835 to 279.855[, during the fiscal year employs indi-4 viduals with disabilities for not less than 75 percent of the work hours of direct labor required for the $\mathbf{5}$ manufacture or provision of the products or services]. 6

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SECTION 2. ORS 279.840 is amended to read:

8 279.840. The policy of this state and the purpose of ORS 279.835 to 279.855, 279A.025 (4) and 9 279C.335 [is to further the policy of this state to] are to encourage and assist individuals with disabilities to achieve maximum personal independence [through useful and productive gainful employ-10 ment] by [assuring] ensuring an expanded and constant market for [sheltered workshop and activity 11 12 center] products and services that individuals with disabilities provide through useful and productive gainful employment, thereby enhancing [their] the individuals' dignity and capacity for 13 self-support and minimizing [their] the individuals' dependence on welfare and need for costly 14 15 institutionalization.

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SECTION 3. ORS 279.845 is amended to read:

279.845. (1) [It is the duty of] The Oregon Department of Administrative Services [to] shall:

18 (a) Determine the price of [all] products and services that a qualified nonprofit agency for 19 individuals with disabilities produces or provides to public agencies [manufactured and services 20offered for sale to the various public agencies by any qualified nonprofit agency for individuals with disabilities]. The price [shall] must recover for the [workshops] qualified nonprofit agency the cost 2122of raw materials, labor, overhead[,] and delivery costs and of a margin [held] the qualified 23nonprofit agency holds in reserve for inventory and equipment replacement;

(b) [To] Revise [such prices] from time to time the price the department determines under 2425**paragraph** (a) of this subsection [from time to time] in accordance with changing cost factors; 26[and]

27(c) Verify that the qualified nonprofit agency for individuals with disabilities pays the minimum wage or prevailing rate of wage set forth in state or federal law; and 28

[(c)] (d) [To make such rules regarding] Adopt rules to set specifications, specify [time of] de-2930 livery times and address other relevant matters of procedure as [shall be] are necessary to carry 31 out the purposes of ORS 279.835 to 279.855, 279A.025 (4) and 279C.335.

(2) The department shall establish and publish a list of sources or potential sources of products 32[produced by any] and services that a qualified nonprofit agency for individuals with disabilities 33 34 [and the services provided by any such agency, which] produces or provides and that the depart-35 ment determines are suitable for [procurement by] public agencies [pursuant to] to procure under ORS 279.835 to 279.855, 279A.025 (4) and 279C.335. [This] The department shall distribute the 36 37 procurement list and revisions [thereof shall be distributed] to the procurement list to all public 38 purchasing officers.

(3) The department may not delegate [any duty imposed under] a duty that this section imposes 39 40 on the department to any other person or public agency [outside of the department].

SECTION 4. ORS 279.850 is amended to read: 41

42279.850. (1) If [any] a public agency intends to procure [any] a product or service on the procurement list the Oregon Department of Administrative Services established under ORS 43 279.845, [that] the public agency shall, in accordance with the department's rules [of the Oregon 44 Department of Administrative Services], procure [such] the product or service[,] at the price the 45

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1 department established [by the department,] from a qualified nonprofit agency for individuals with

disabilities, provided that the product or service is of the appropriate specifications and is available
within the period [*required by that*] the public agency requires.

(2) In furthering the purposes of ORS 279.835 to 279.855, 279A.025 (4) and 279C.335, [it is the 4 intent of] the Legislative Assembly [that there be close cooperation between the] intends that the 5 department, public [contracting] agencies and qualified nonprofit agencies for individuals with disa-6 bilities cooperate closely. The department, on behalf of public [contracting] agencies and qualified 7 nonprofit agencies for individuals with disabilities, [is authorized to] may enter into [such] contrac-8 9 tual agreements, cooperative working relationships or other arrangements [as may be determined to be] that are necessary [for effective coordination and efficient realization of] to effectively coordi-10 nate and efficiently realize the objectives of ORS 279.835 to 279.855, 279A.025 (4) and 279C.335 and 11 12 any other law [requiring] that governs a procurement of products or services.

SECTION 5. The amendments to ORS 279.835, 279.840, 279.845 and 279.850 by sections 1 to 4 of this 2013 Act apply to contracts that a public agency advertises or otherwise solicits or, if the public agency does not advertise or otherwise solicit the contract, to contracts into which the public agency enters on or after the operative date specified in section 6 of this 2013 Act.

18 <u>SECTION 6.</u> (1) The amendments to ORS 279.835, 279.840, 279.845 and 279.850 by sections
 19 1 to 4 of this 2013 Act become operative January 1, 2014.

20(2) The Director of the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, the Director of Transportation, the Attorney General or a public agency that is authorized by law or rule 2122to conduct a procurement may take any action before the operative date specified in sub-23section (1) of this section that is necessary to enable the director, the Attorney General or the public agency to exercise, on and after the operative date specified in subsection (1) of 24this section, the duties, functions and powers conferred on the director, the Attorney Gen-25eral or the public agency by the amendments to ORS 279.835, 279.840, 279.845 and 279.850 by 2627sections 1 to 4 of this 2013 Act.

28 <u>SECTION 7.</u> This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 29 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect 30 on its passage.

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
