## House Bill 2786

Sponsored by Representative WHISNANT

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Directs state agencies to file with Senate and House interim committees on general government affairs annual report describing amount of federal funds received by agency in preceding fiscal year and source and amount of any required state matching funds.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to state financial administration; and declaring an emergency.
  - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
    - **SECTION 1.** (1) As used in this section:
  - (a) "Federal funds" means "federal financial assistance," as defined in 31 U.S.C. 7501, that is reported in a single audit.
    - (b) "Single audit" has the meaning given that term in 31 U.S.C. 7501.
  - (c) "State agency" means any officer, board, commission, department, division or entity in the executive department as defined in ORS 174.112.
  - (2) Not later than November 1 of each year, a state agency that receives federal funds shall file a report with the interim committees of the Senate and House of Representatives that have responsibility for general government affairs. The report shall describe:
  - (a) The aggregate amount of federal funds received by the state agency for the immediately preceding fiscal year ending June 30; and
  - (b) The amount and source of any state matching funds that are required as a condition of receiving the federal funds.
  - SECTION 2. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect on its passage.

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
