

House Bill 2827

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON CONSUMER PROTECTION AND GOVERNMENT EFFICIENCY

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires contracting agency to pay fee to Secretary of State in amount of five one-hundredths of one percent of contract price for public improvement contract. Requires Secretary of State to use proceeds of fee to conduct financial, performance and compliance audits of public contracts in accordance with certain standards.

Establishes Public Contracting Audit Account in General Fund of State Treasury. Continuously appropriates moneys in account to Secretary of State for purpose of conducting audits of public contracts.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

2 Relating to public contracts; appropriating money; and declaring an emergency.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2013 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 279C.**

5 **SECTION 2. (1) A contracting agency that conducts a procurement subject to this chap-**
6 **ter, in addition to and not in lieu of the charges specified in ORS 297.230, shall pay a fee**
7 **equivalent to five one-hundredths of one percent of the contract price for the procurement**
8 **to the office of the Secretary of State at the time the contracting agency executes the con-**
9 **tract. The Secretary of State shall pay the moneys the Secretary of State receives under this**
10 **subsection to the State Treasurer for deposit in the Public Contracting Audit Account cre-**
11 **ated under section 4 of this 2013 Act.**

12 **(2)(a) The Secretary of State shall use the moneys available in the Public Contracting**
13 **Audit Account to conduct financial, compliance and performance audits of public contracts**
14 **that contracting agencies award under the provisions of this chapter. The Secretary of State**
15 **shall conduct each audit according to standards adopted under ORS 297.070 and, except as**
16 **provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection, without advance notice to the contracting**
17 **agency or other parties to the public contract.**

18 **(b) If the Secretary of State finds during an audit or receives at any time reliable infor-**
19 **mation concerning fraud, waste, misconduct or abuse for a particular public contract, the**
20 **Secretary of State may conduct a special investigation of the contracting agency or other**
21 **parties to the public contract and may use moneys from the Public Contracting Audit Ac-**
22 **count to conduct the special investigation.**

23 **(c) The Secretary of State, in accordance with policies and priorities that the Secretary**
24 **of State establishes, each year shall allocate the amount of moneys available or projected to**
25 **be available in the Public Contracting Audit Account during the year toward conducting a**
26 **regular course of audits under this section.**

27 **(3) In addition to complying with the requirements of ORS 297.050, the Secretary of State**
28 **shall publish the report for every audit the Secretary of State conducts under this section**

3 **SECTION 3.** Section 4 of this 2013 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 297.

4 **SECTION 4.** The Public Contracting Audit Account is established in the General Fund
5 of the State Treasury. All moneys in the Public Contracting Audit Account are continuously
6 appropriated to the Secretary of State for the purposes set forth in section 2 of this 2013
7 Act.

8 **SECTION 5.** This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
9 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect
10 on its passage.

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
