House Bill 2842

Sponsored by Representatives BENTZ, WHITSETT; Representatives ESQUIVEL, HICKS, JENSON, KRIEGER, THOMPSON

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Prohibits Environmental Quality Commission and Department of Environmental Quality from adopting any rule or issuing any order concerning water quality that imposes requirements, standards or any other limitation that exceeds requirements, standards or any other limitation imposed under federal law.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to water quality; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. Neither the Environmental Quality Commission or the Department of Environmental Quality may adopt any rule or issue any order concerning water quality that imposes requirements, standards or any other limitation that exceeds requirements, standards or any other limitation imposed under federal law.

SECTION 2. (1)(a) Section 1 of this 2013 Act applies to rules adopted and orders issued by the Environmental Quality Commission before, on or after the effective date of this 2013 Act.

- (b) Section 1 of this 2013 Act applies to rules adopted and orders issued by the Department of Environmental Quality before, on or after the effective date of this 2013 Act.
- (2) Any rule adopted or order issued by the Environmental Quality Commission or the Department of Environmental Quality before the effective date of this 2013 Act concerning water quality that imposes requirements, standards or any other limitation that exceeds requirements, standards or any other limitation imposed under federal law is void.

SECTION 3. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect on its passage.
