House Bill 2864

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Establishes Task Force on Local Control of Education. Sunsets task force on date of convening of 2015 legislative session. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

1 A BILL FOR AN ACT Relating to local control of education; and declaring an emergency. 2 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 3 SECTION 1. (1) The Task Force on Local Control of Education is established. 4 (2) The task force consists of six members appointed as follows: 5 (a) The President of the Senate shall appoint three members from among members of the 6 Senate. 7 8 (b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint three members from among members of the House of Representatives. 9 (3) The task force shall conduct hearings and request any reports necessary to determine 10 the impact of chapter 519, Oregon Laws 2011 (Enrolled Senate Bill 909), and chapter 36, 11 12 Oregon Laws 2012 (Enrolled Senate Bill 1581), on the ability of school district boards to determine what is taught in the schools of this state and how the school district boards 1314 measure achievement. (4) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction 15 16 of business. 17(5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the members 18 of the task force. 19 (6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson. 20 (7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appointment to become immediately effective. 2122(8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson 23or of a majority of the members of the task force. (9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force. 24(10) The task force may presession file legislation in the manner provided in ORS 171.130 25 for interim committees. All legislation recommended by official action of the task force must 26 indicate that it is introduced at the request of the task force. 27 (11) The task force shall report to the Legislative Assembly in the manner provided in 28 ORS 192.245 at any time within 30 days after its final meeting or at such later time as the 29 President and Speaker may designate. 30 (12) The Legislative Administrator may employ persons necessary for the performance 31

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of the functions of the task force. The Legislative Administrator shall fix the duties and
amounts of compensation of these employees. The task force shall use the services of continuing legislative staff, without employing additional persons, to the greatest extent practicable.
(13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist

6 the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating 7 to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force 8 consider necessary to perform their duties.

9 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2013 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the 2015
 10 regular session of the Legislative Assembly as specified in ORS 171.010.

11 SECTION 3. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 12 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect 13 on its passage.

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
