SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Makes permanent] Directs Department of Revenue, no later than February 1, 2014, to report to Legislative Assembly on progress in implementing pilot project that requires certain licensees to demonstrate and maintain tax compliance as condition of issuance or renewal of license. Directs department to include in report plans for development and improvement of project and recommendations for expansion. [Phases in program requirements, based on size of board and type of tax program, until requirements apply to all state agencies, boards or commissions that issue occupational licenses or licenses for privilege of engaging in occupation or profession.]

[Directs Department of Revenue to establish automated method for tax compliance certification not later than January 1, 2014.]

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

A BILL FOR AN ACT Relating to tax compliance; and prescribing an effective date. Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: <u>SECTION 1.</u> The Department of Revenue shall report to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to revenue, no later than February 1, 2014, on its progress in implementing the pilot project described in section 2, chapter 576, Oregon Laws 2009. The report shall: (1) Include a plan to further develop and improve the pilot project based upon evidence obtained by the department during implementation of the pilot project and upon the department's experience during implementation. (2) Recommend methods by which the pilot project could be expanded to include other state agencies, boards or commissions in an efficient and feasible manner.

- <u>SECTION 2.</u> This 2013 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2013
 regular session of the Seventy-seventh Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.
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
