## House Bill 2901

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Creates offense of equine tripping. Makes violation subject to punishment by maximum of six months' imprisonment, \$2,500 fine, or both.

4	SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section, "equine" means any member of the family

6	(2) A person commits the offense of equine tripping if the person intentionally causes ar
7	equine to trip or fall, or intentionally ropes or lassos the legs of an equine, for purposes o
8	a rodeo, contest, exhibition, entertainment or sport or as practice for a rodeo, contest, ex
9	hibition, entertainment or sport.
10	(3) The offense of equine tripping is a Class B misdemeanor.
11	SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2013 Act applies to conduct occurring on or after the ef
12	fective date of this 2013 Act.
