House Bill 2957

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Increases penalty for committing robbery with simulated deadly weapon. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Relating to crime; amending ORS 164.405 and 164.415; and declaring an emergency. 2 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: SECTION 1. ORS 164.405 is amended to read: 4 164.405. (1) A person commits the crime of robbery in the second degree if the person violates 5 6 ORS 164.395 and the person: 7 (a) Represents by word or conduct that the person is armed with what purports to be a dangerous or deadly weapon, but does not display an object that a reasonable person would pre-8 9 sume to be a deadly weapon; or (b) Is aided by another person actually present. 10 (2) Robbery in the second degree is a Class B felony. 11 12 SECTION 2. ORS 164.415 is amended to read: 164.415. (1) A person commits the crime of robbery in the first degree if the person violates ORS 13 164.395 and the person: 14 (a) Is armed with a deadly weapon or displays an object that a reasonable person would 15 presume to be a deadly weapon; 16 17 (b) Uses or attempts to use a dangerous weapon; or (c) Causes or attempts to cause serious physical injury to any person. 18 (2) Robbery in the first degree is a Class A felony. 19 20 SECTION 3. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public

peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect
