## House Bill 3024

Sponsored by Representative FREDERICK; Representatives BARTON, BOONE, GARRETT, GREENLICK, WILLIAMSON, WITT

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs Oregon Business Development Department to conduct study of sites ready for industrial development. Requires department to report to legislative committees regarding findings of study. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to development of industrial sites; and declaring an emergency.

**3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) No later than January 1, 2014, the Oregon Business Development De-

5 partment shall conduct a study to determine the number and location of sites throughout

6 the state that are ready, or may be ready within a reasonable time, for industrial develop-

7 ment. The study shall include consultation with and input from:

- 8 (a) Local governments as defined in ORS 174.116;
- 9 (b) Regional economic development organizations;
- 10 (c) Community development corporations or organizations;
- 11 (d) Community development projects as defined in ORS 285B.410;
- 12 (e) Ports as defined in ORS 285A.603;
- 13 (f) The Economic Revitalization Team established under ORS 284.555; and
- 14 (g) State agencies as identified by the department by rule.
- 15 (2) A site shall be considered ready for industrial development when the site is:
- 16 (a) Of sufficient size to meet industrial needs, taking into account inquiries received by
- the department from persons or entities seeking to engage in industrial development of sites
  in this state;
- 19 (b) Owned and held in a manner that facilitates efficient industrial development;
- (c) Within the jurisdiction of a local government that shows a willingness to cooperate
   in the industrial development of the site;

(d) Served by necessary public facilities and infrastructure, including transportation fa cilities or those facilities and infrastructure that can be provided within a reasonable period

- (e) Subject to few, if any, environmental constraints or subject to constraints that can
   be mitigated within a reasonable period of time; and
- (f) Zoned in a manner that allows the desired industrial development, or can be zoned in
  a manner to allow the desired development within a reasonable period of time.
- (3) On or before the date of the convening of the 2014 regular session of the Legislative
   Assembly as specified in ORS 171.010, the department shall prepare and submit a report to

1 committees of the Legislative Assembly related to business and economic development. The

2 report may contain recommendations for legislation and shall report on the findings of the

3 study conducted under this section. At a minimum, the report must contain:

4 (a) An estimate of the amount of time that would be required to complete industrial de-5 velopment of identified sites;

6 (b) An estimate of the cost to develop identified sites; and

7 (c) Requirements that must be complied with to develop the identified sites.

8 <u>SECTION 2.</u> This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public

9 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect
10 on its passage.
