House Bill 3071

Sponsored by Representatives HOLVEY, HOYLE; Representatives BARTON, BOONE, FREDERICK, GARRETT, GORSEK, GREENLICK, KOMP, WILLIAMSON, WITT

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Requires consumer contract that provides for early termination fee to include clear and conspicuous disclosure of amount of fee and total amount consumer must pay under consumer contract to avoid early termination fee.

Provides that failure to give required notice or charging, collecting or attempting to collect or receiving early termination fee without consumer's express consent to contract after opportunity to read disclosure is unlawful practice and that early termination fee is void and unenforceable.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to unlawful practices in connection with consumer contracts; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 646.608.
- 4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2013 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 646.605 to 646.652.
 - **SECTION 2.** (1) As used in this section:
 - (a) "Clear and conspicuous" means language that is readily understandable and that is presented in direct proximity to a request for consent in a contract offer in such a manner as to be noticed and understood in comparison with other language by means of size, color, contrast, location, audibility or cadence.
 - (b) "Consumer" means an individual who purchases or seeks to purchase real estate, goods or services for personal, family or household purposes.
 - (c)(A) "Consumer contract" means an agreement or a renewal of an agreement between a consumer and another person for the purchase or sale of real estate, goods or services for personal, family or household purposes.
 - (B) "Consumer contract" does not include:
 - (i) An agreement for insurance;
- 19 (ii) A certificate of deposit;
 - (iii) A consumer finance loan, as defined in ORS 725.010;
- 21 (iv) A rental agreement, as defined in ORS 90.100;
- 22 (v) A lease-purchase agreement, as defined in ORS 646A.120; or
- 23 (vi) A service contract, as described in ORS 646A.154.
 - (d) "Early termination fee" means any expense or obligation that a consumer incurs under a contract as a result of the consumer's terminating or canceling the contract before the contract ends in accordance with the contract's terms.
 - (e) "Express consent" means a consumer's agreement to become obligated under a consumer contract, evidence for which a consumer gives by means of the consumer's signature,

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oral words of acceptance or another indication of the consumer's intent.

(2) A consumer contract that provides for an early termination fee must also provide the
following notice in a clear and conspicuous manner at the time a consumer executes, extended
or renews the consumer contract:

OREGON FULL-COST DISCLOSURE: This contract includes a cancellation penalty of \$______. The total amount of payments that you will have to make under this contract to avoid owing a cancellation penalty is \$______.

- (3) A person may not charge, collect or attempt to collect or receive an early termination fee unless the consumer gave express consent to the consumer contract that provides for the fee after having an opportunity to read the notice described in subsection (2) of this section at the time the consumer executed, extended or renewed the consumer contract.
- (4) A person engages in an unlawful practice under ORS 646.608 if the person executes a consumer contract with a consumer that provides for an early termination fee and does not include the notice described in subsection (2) of this section or if the person charges, collects or attempts to collect or receives an early termination fee without the consumer's express consent to the consumer contract that provides for the fee. In addition, the early termination fee provision in the consumer contract is void and unenforceable.
- **SECTION 3.** ORS 646.608, as amended by section 6, chapter 52, Oregon Laws 2012, is amended to read:
- 646.608. (1) A person engages in an unlawful practice when in the course of the person's business, vocation or occupation the person does any of the following:
 - (a) Passes off real estate, goods or services as those of another.
- (b) Causes likelihood of confusion or of misunderstanding as to the source, sponsorship, approval, or certification of real estate, goods or services.
- (c) Causes likelihood of confusion or of misunderstanding as to affiliation, connection, or association with, or certification by, another.
- (d) Uses deceptive representations or designations of geographic origin in connection with real estate, goods or services.
- (e) Represents that real estate, goods or services have sponsorship, approval, characteristics, ingredients, uses, benefits, quantities or qualities that [they] the real estate, goods or services do not have or that a person has a sponsorship, approval, status, qualification, affiliation, or connection that the person does not have.
- (f) Represents that real estate or goods are original or new if [they] the real estate or goods are deteriorated, altered, reconditioned, reclaimed, used or secondhand.
- (g) Represents that real estate, goods or services are of a particular standard, quality, or grade, or that real estate or goods are of a particular style or model, if [they] the real estate, goods or services are of another.
- (h) Disparages the real estate, goods, services, property or business of a customer or another by false or misleading representations of fact.
- (i) Advertises real estate, goods or services with intent not to provide [them] the real estate, goods or services as advertised, or with intent not to supply reasonably expectable public demand,

unless the advertisement discloses a limitation of quantity.

- (j) Makes false or misleading representations of fact concerning the reasons for, existence of, or amounts of price reductions.
- (k) Makes false or misleading representations concerning credit availability or the nature of the transaction or obligation incurred.
- (L) Makes false or misleading representations relating to commissions or other compensation to be paid in exchange for permitting real estate, goods or services to be used for model or demonstration purposes or in exchange for submitting names of potential customers.
- (m) Performs service on or dismantles any goods or real estate when [not authorized by] the owner or apparent owner [thereof] of the goods or real estate does not authorize the service or dismantling.
- (n) Solicits potential customers by telephone or door to door as a seller unless the person provides the information required under ORS 646.611.
- (o) In a sale, rental or other disposition of real estate, goods or services, gives or offers to give a rebate or discount or otherwise pays or offers to pay value to the customer in consideration of the customer giving to the person the names of prospective purchasers, lessees, or borrowers, or otherwise aiding the person in making a sale, lease, or loan to another person, if earning the rebate, discount or other value is contingent upon [occurrence of] an event [subsequent to] occurring after the time the customer enters into the transaction.
- (p) Makes any false or misleading statement about a prize, contest or promotion used to publicize a product, business or service.
- (q) Promises to deliver real estate, goods or services within a certain period of time with intent not to deliver [them] the real estate, goods or services as promised.
 - (r) Organizes or induces or attempts to induce membership in a pyramid club.
- (s) Makes false or misleading representations of fact concerning the offering price of, or the person's cost for real estate, goods or services.
- (t) Concurrent with tender or delivery of any real estate, goods or services fails to disclose any known material defect or material nonconformity.
 - (u) Engages in any other unfair or deceptive conduct in trade or commerce.
- (v) Violates any of the provisions relating to auction sales, auctioneers or auction marts under ORS 698.640, whether in a commercial or noncommercial situation.
 - (w) Manufactures mercury fever thermometers.
- (x) Sells or supplies mercury fever thermometers unless the thermometer is required by federal law, or is:
 - (A) Prescribed by a person licensed under ORS chapter 677; and
- (B) Supplied with instructions on the careful handling of the thermometer to avoid breakage and on the proper cleanup of mercury should breakage occur.
- (y) Sells a thermostat that contains mercury unless the thermostat is labeled in a manner to inform the purchaser that mercury is present in the thermostat and that the thermostat may not be disposed of until the mercury is removed, reused, recycled or otherwise managed to ensure that the mercury does not become part of the solid waste stream or wastewater. For purposes of this paragraph, "thermostat" means a device commonly used to sense and, through electrical communication with heating, cooling or ventilation equipment, control room temperature.
- (z) Sells or offers for sale a motor vehicle manufactured after January 1, 2006, that contains mercury light switches.

 - (4) An action or suit may not be brought under subsection (1)(u) of this section unless the Attorney General has first established a rule in accordance with the provisions of ORS chapter 183 declaring the conduct to be unfair or deceptive in trade or commerce.
 - (5) Notwithstanding any other provision of ORS 646.605 to 646.652, if an action or suit is brought under subsection (1)(xx) of this section by a person other than a prosecuting attorney, relief is limited to an injunction and the prevailing party may be awarded reasonable attorney fees.

SECTION 4. Section 2 of this 2013 Act and the amendments to ORS 646.608 by section 3 of this 2013 Act apply to consumer contracts entered into on or after the effective date of this 2013 Act.

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
