House Bill 3149

Sponsored by Representative GORSEK

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Establishes Task Force on Community College Child Care Services. Sunsets task force on date of convening of 2015 regular session of Legislative Assembly. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to community college childcare services; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Task Force on Community College Child Care Services is established.

5 (2) The task force consists of members appointed by the Commissioner for Community

6 College Services. The commissioner shall appoint members who represent community college

7 administrators, community college faculty, community college students, the board of educa-

8 tion of a community college district, the Department of Community Colleges and Workforce

9 Development and the Child Care Division of the Employment Department. At least two

10 members of the task force must be community college faculty and at least two members of

11 the task force must be community college students.

12 (3) The task force shall:

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13 (a) Study the cost of providing child care services to students of community colleges; and

(b) Identify sources for funding the cost of providing child care services to students of
 community colleges.

(4) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction
 of business.

(5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the members
 of the task force.

20 (6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.

(7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the commissioner shall make an appointment to
 become immediately effective.

(8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson
or of a majority of the members of the task force.

25 (9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.

(10) The task force shall submit a report, and may include recommendations for legis lation, to the interim legislative committees on education no later than September 1, 2014.

(11) The Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development shall provide
 staff support to the task force.

30 (12) Members of the task force are not entitled to compensation or reimbursement for 31 expenses and serve as volunteers of the task force.

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(13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist
the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating
to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force
consider necessary to perform their duties.
SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2013 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the 2015

6 regular session of the Legislative Assembly as specified in ORS 171.010.

7 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 8 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect 9 on its passage.

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
