

House Bill 3189

Sponsored by Representative REARDON, Senator MONROE; Representatives PARRISH, VEGA PEDERSON, Senator THOMSEN

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Establishes certification requirements for school-based health centers. Requires Oregon Health Authority to adopt rules.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

1
2 Relating to school-based health centers.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section, "school-based health center" means a permanent**
5 **space located within a school building or on a school campus that is used exclusively for the**
6 **purpose of providing primary care, preventive health care, behavioral and dental health care**
7 **and health education services.**

8 (2) State funds may not be used to support, in whole or in part, a school-based health
9 center unless the center is certified by the Oregon Health Authority.

10 (3) The authority shall establish an application process and shall adopt by rule the cri-
11 teria for certifying a school-based health center.

12 (4) A certified school-based health center must offer all of the following services on-site,
13 as prescribed by the authority by rule:

14 (a) Primary care including, but not limited to:

15 (A) Comprehensive medical and psychosocial histories;

16 (B) Immunizations;

17 (C) Evaluation and treatment of nonurgent, acute and chronic conditions; and

18 (D) Triage of medical emergencies.

19 (b) Health screenings including, but not limited to:

20 (A) Height, weight and body mass index measurements;

21 (B) Blood pressure screening;

22 (C) Vision screening; and

23 (D) Scoliosis screening.

24 (c) Dental care including, but not limited to:

25 (A) Preventive dental treatment; and

26 (B) Comprehensive dental evaluation and treatment.

27 (d) Written prescriptions for nonurgent, acute and chronic conditions.

28 (e) Age-appropriate reproductive health services.

29 (f) Preventive health services including, but not limited to:

30 (A) Age-appropriate guidance;

31 (B) Risk factor assessment; and

NOTE: Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter [*italic and bracketed*] is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

- 1 **(C) Targeted patient education.**
 - 2 **(g) Mental health services including, but not limited to:**
 - 3 **(A) Individual mental health assessment;**
 - 4 **(B) Alcohol and other drug preliminary assessment; and**
 - 5 **(C) Crisis intervention services coordinated with the school's crisis intervention plan.**
 - 6 **(h) Health promotion and health education activities.**
 - 7 **(5) The authority may prescribe by rule the services that must be provided by a certified**
 - 8 **school-based health center off-site or by referral.**
 - 9 **(6) Services may be provided by supervised students enrolled in the professional medical,**
 - 10 **nursing or dental programs at Oregon Health and Science University or any other accredited**
 - 11 **university and by expanded practice dental hygienists meeting the requirements of ORS**
 - 12 **680.200.**
 - 13 **(7) The authority may temporarily waive any of the certification requirements to allow**
 - 14 **a center to correct any compliance defects.**
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
