House Bill 3196

Sponsored by JOINT COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC SAFETY

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Allows physical custody of person who is transferred to Oregon Youth Authority to include, at youth authority's discretion, certain nonsecure features.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to Oregon Youth Authority; declaring an emergency; and providing for criminal sentence reduction that requires approval by a two-thirds majority.
- Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - SECTION 1. (1) For a person who is transferred into the physical custody of the Oregon Youth Authority pursuant to ORS 137.124 or otherwise, the physical custody may, at the discretion of the youth authority, include supervision of the person by the youth authority that:
 - (a) Allows the person to have freedom of movement, for an authorized purpose, inside and outside the facility in which the person is housed;
 - (b) Requires the person to wear, carry or use an item with a radio frequency identification device for the purpose of locating or tracking the whereabouts of the person at any time; or
 - (c) Permits the person to participate in, under the supervision of an agreed-upon third party in accordance with specified standards and criteria of operation, approved events, activities, programs or opportunities that are not located at the facility where the person is housed.
 - (2) For purposes of this section, "person" means:
 - (a) A person who is committed to the Department of Corrections under ORS 137.707 and whose physical custody has been transferred to the youth authority under ORS 420.011 or other statute and who is completing a sentence imposed on the person under ORS 137.707;
 - (b) A youth as defined in ORS 419A.004; and
 - (c) A youth offender as defined in ORS 419A.004.
 - SECTION 2. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect on its passage.
