

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO A-ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL 3231

1 On page 1 of the printed A-engrossed bill, line 8, after “supports” delete the rest of the line and
2 insert “educational success, focuses on crime prevention, reduces high risk behaviors”.

3 In line 9, delete “criminal involvement”.

4 On page 3, delete lines 9 through 45.

5 On page 4, delete lines 1 through 33 and insert:

6 “**SECTION 4.** Section 21, chapter 37, Oregon Laws 2012, as amended by section 23, chapter 37,
7 Oregon Laws 2012, is amended to read:

8 “**Sec. 21.** (1) The Youth Development Council is established. **The council shall function under**
9 **the direction and control of the Oregon Education Investment Board established by section**
10 **1, chapter 519, Oregon Laws 2011.**

11 “(2) The council is established for the purpose of **assisting the board in** overseeing a unified
12 system that provides services to school-age children through youth 20 years of age in a manner that
13 supports [*academic success, reduces criminal involvement*] **educational success, focuses on crime**
14 **prevention, reduces high risk behaviors** and is integrated, measurable and accountable. **The**
15 **council shall provide direction to the Youth Development Division.**

16 “(3) The council consists of no fewer than 15 members who are appointed by the Governor. The
17 Governor shall ensure that membership of the council satisfies any federal requirements for mem-
18 bership of a state advisory committee on juvenile justice.

19 “(4) The council shall:

20 “[*(a) Prioritize funding for prevention and intervention services related to gang violence and gang*
21 *involvement.*]

22 “(a) **Determine the availability of funding to support community-based youth development**
23 **programs, services and initiatives with demonstrated outcomes and strategic objectives es-**
24 **tablished by the council by rule.**

25 “(b) **Prioritize funding for services related to:**

26 “(A) **The prevention of and intervention in the risk factors that lead to juvenile delin-**
27 **quency and the promotion of protective factors that improve the health and well-being of**
28 **children and youth, as supported by evidence-based program models and other research-**
29 **based models; and**

30 “(B) **The prevention of and intervention in gang violence and gang involvement.**

31 “(5) **The council may:**

32 “(a) **Enter into performance-based intergovernmental agreements with regional and**
33 **county entities, and tribal governments, to contract for the provision of youth development**
34 **programs, services and initiatives that will achieve demonstrated outcomes and strategic**
35 **objectives established by the council by rule.**

1 “(b) Determine the means by which services to children and youth may be provided effectively
2 and efficiently across multiple programs to improve the academic and social outcomes of children
3 and youth.

4 “(c) Assess state programs and services related to youth development and training, and identify
5 methods by which programs and services may be coordinated or consolidated.

6 “(d) Establish common academic and social indicators to support attainment of goals established
7 by the [council] **board**.

8 “(e) Establish common program outcome measurements and coordinate data collection across
9 multiple programs and services.

10 “(f) Ensure implementation of best practices that:

11 “(A) Are evidence based;

12 “(B) Are culturally, gender and age appropriate;

13 “(C) Address individual risk factors;

14 “(D) Build upon factors that [*increase*] **improve** the health and well-being of children and youth;
15 and

16 “(E) Include tribal best practices.

17 “(5) The Governor may designate one member of the council to serve as the chairperson or, if
18 the Governor chooses not to designate a chairperson, the council may elect one of its members to
19 serve as chairperson.

20 “(6) In accordance with applicable provisions of ORS chapter 183, the council may adopt rules
21 necessary for the administration of the laws that the council is charged with administering.

22 “**SECTION 5.** Section 21, chapter 37, Oregon Laws 2012, as amended by section 23, chapter 37,
23 Oregon Laws 2012, and section 4 of this 2013 Act, is amended to read:

24 “**Sec. 21.** (1) The Youth Development Council is established. [*The council shall function under*
25 *the direction and control of the Oregon Education Investment Board established by section 1, chapter*
26 *519, Oregon Laws 2011.*]

27 “(2) The council is established for the purpose of [*assisting the board in*] overseeing a unified
28 system that provides services to school-age children through youth 20 years of age in a manner that
29 supports educational success, focuses on crime prevention, reduces high risk behaviors and is inte-
30 grated, measurable and accountable. The council shall provide direction to the Youth Development
31 Division.

32 “(3) The council consists of no fewer than 15 members who are appointed by the Governor. The
33 Governor shall ensure that membership of the council satisfies any federal requirements for mem-
34 bership of a state advisory committee on juvenile justice.

35 “(4) The council shall:

36 “(a) Determine the availability of funding to support community-based youth development pro-
37 grams, services and initiatives with demonstrated outcomes and strategic objectives established by

24 On page 20, after line 21, insert:

25 “**SECTION 23. The Youth Development Council shall submit a report to the appropriate**
26 **interim legislative committees on or before January 1, 2014. The report must provide a**
27 **funding allocation plan that can be implemented no later than July 1, 2014, and that is for:**

28 “(1) All services provided by the council;

29 “(2) Juvenile crime prevention programs; and

30 “(3) New investments in youth development programs and services that align with and
31 support goals established by the Oregon Education Investment Board.”.

32 In line 22, delete “23” and insert “24”.

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
