# B-Engrossed House Bill 3233

Ordered by the House June 26 Including House Amendments dated April 23 and June 26

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Establishes Network of Quality Teaching and Learning. Prescribes purposes of network and methods for accomplishing purposes.

Adjusts method for calculating amount of grants awarded under School District Collaboration Grant Program.

Directs Oregon Education Investment Board to submit report related to teachers to interim legislative committees on education.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2013.

4	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
5	SECTION 1. (1) The Network of Quality Teaching and Learning is established. The net-
6	work consists of the Oregon Education Investment Board, the Department of Education and
7	public and private entities that receive funding as provided by this section to accomplish the
8	purposes of the network described in subsection (2) of this section.
9	(2) The purposes of the network are the following:
10	(a) To enhance a culture of leadership and collaborative responsibility for advancing the
11	profession of teaching among providers of early learning services, teachers and administra-
12	tors in kindergarten through grade 12, education service districts and teacher education in-
13	stitutions.

15	achievement, including practices advanced by or described in ORS 329.788 to 329.820, 329.822,

Any rules adopted by the State Board of Education must be consistent with this section and with 14 15 actions taken by the Oregon Education Investment Board to implement this section.

- 5 <u>SECTION 6.</u> This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 6 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect 7 July 1, 2013.
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
