Requires state agencies to use in-state providers of health care items and services instead of out-of-state providers under specified conditions.

| 7 | (1) A provider that can furnish the same or a better quality item or service is available |
| 8 | to furnish the item or service and is reasonably accessible to the person needing the item |
| 9 | or service; and |
| 10 | (2) The market for health care items and services is competitive in the geographic region |
| 11 | where the items or services are to be purchased. |
