SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Authorizes governing body of Malheur County to plan and zone up to five sites, containing 1,000 or fewer acres each, for industrial use.

Sunsets authority December 31, 2020.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to industrial use of land in Malheur County.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. (1) The governing body of Malheur County may plan and zone up to five sites for industrial use:

(a) In addition to and not in lieu of other lawful opportunities to plan and zone land for industrial use within the county; and

(b) Notwithstanding provisions of a statewide land use planning goal related to:

(A) Urbanization that requires demonstrated need to accommodate long-range urban population or demonstrated need for employment opportunities; and

(B) Public facilities and services.

(2) A site is eligible to be planned and zoned pursuant to this section if:

(a) The site contains 1,000 acres or fewer; and

(b) Water, sanitary sewer service and electricity are available at a boundary of the site or on a lawfully established unit of land, as defined in ORS 92.010, adjoining the site.

SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2013 Act is repealed on December 31, 2020.
