

# House Bill 3302

Sponsored by Representative BARNHART; Representative NATHANSON

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Establishes Task Force on School Records.  
Sunsets task force on date of convening of 2015 regular session of Legislative Assembly.  
Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

1  
2 Relating to recordkeeping by educational entities; and declaring an emergency.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) The Task Force on School Records is established.**

5 **(2) The task force consists of members appointed by the Superintendent of Public In-**  
6 **struction. The superintendent shall appoint members who represent providers of support**  
7 **services at schools and school districts, administrators, superintendents, school district**  
8 **boards and other groups identified by the superintendent. To the extent practicable, the su-**  
9 **perintendent shall ensure that the members of the task force represent a diversity in ge-**  
10 **ography and in school district size.**

11 **(3) The task force shall:**

12 **(a) Identify recordkeeping functions of schools and school districts that may be more**  
13 **efficiently and more securely maintained in a central location, including student records and**  
14 **financial records;**

15 **(b) Develop a timeline for establishing the maintenance of records in a central location;**  
16 **and**

17 **(c) Determine costs associated with establishing and sustaining a system that maintains**  
18 **records at a central location.**

19 **(4) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction**  
20 **of business.**

21 **(5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the members**  
22 **of the task force.**

23 **(6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.**

24 **(7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the superintendent shall make an appointment**  
25 **to become immediately effective.**

26 **(8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson**  
27 **or of a majority of the members of the task force.**

28 **(9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.**

29 **(10) The task force shall submit a report, and may include recommendations for legis-**  
30 **lation, to the interim legislative committees on education no later than October 1, 2014.**

31 **(11) The Department of Education shall provide staff support to the task force.**

**NOTE:** Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter [*italic and bracketed*] is existing law to be omitted.  
New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

1       **(12) Members of the task force are not entitled to compensation or reimbursement for**  
2 **expenses and serve as volunteers of the task force.**

3       **(13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist**  
4 **the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating**  
5 **to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force**  
6 **consider necessary to perform their duties.**

7       **SECTION 2.** **Section 1 of this 2013 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the 2015**  
8 **regular session of the Legislative Assembly as specified in ORS 171.010.**

9       **SECTION 3.** **This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**  
10 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect**  
11 **on its passage.**

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
