House Bill 3302

Sponsored by Representative BARNHART; Representative NATHANSON

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Establishes Task Force on School Records. Sunsets task force on date of convening of 2015 regular session of Legislative Assembly. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to recordkeeping by educational entities; and declaring an emergency.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - SECTION 1. (1) The Task Force on School Records is established.
 - (2) The task force consists of members appointed by the Superintendent of Public Instruction. The superintendent shall appoint members who represent providers of support services at schools and school districts, administrators, superintendents, school district boards and other groups identified by the superintendent. To the extent practicable, the superintendent shall ensure that the members of the task force represent a diversity in geography and in school district size.
 - (3) The task force shall:

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- (a) Identify recordkeeping functions of schools and school districts that may be more efficiently and more securely maintained in a central location, including student records and financial records;
- (b) Develop a timeline for establishing the maintenance of records in a central location; and
- (c) Determine costs associated with establishing and sustaining a system that maintains records at a central location.
- (4) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business.
- (5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the members of the task force.
 - (6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.
- (7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the superintendent shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.
- (8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the task force.
 - (9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.
- (10) The task force shall submit a report, and may include recommendations for legislation, to the interim legislative committees on education no later than October 1, 2014.
 - (11) The Department of Education shall provide staff support to the task force.

(12) Members of the task force are not entitled to compensation or reimbursemen	t for
expenses and serve as volunteers of the task force.	
(13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to a	assis

(13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force consider necessary to perform their duties.

SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2013 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the 2015 regular session of the Legislative Assembly as specified in ORS 171.010.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect on its passage.
