House Bill 3343

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Modifies authority of Port of Portland to establish contract standards.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to contracting authority of ports; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 778.015.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. ORS 778.015 is amended to read:

778.015. The object, purpose and occupation of the Port of Portland shall be to promote the 5 6 maritime, shipping, aviation, commercial and industrial interests of the port as by law specifically 7 authorized. Subject to section 3 of this 2013 Act, the port may acquire, hold, use, dispose of and convey real and personal property, make any and all contracts the making of which is not by this 8 chapter expressly prohibited. It may do any other acts and things which are requisite, necessary or 9 convenient in accomplishing the purpose described or in carrying out the powers granted to it by 10 law. The port may supply surface and air craft with fuel and other supplies at reasonable cost as 11 12 may be for the best interests of the port.

13 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 3 of this 2013 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 778.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> In awarding contracts and leasing spaces, the Port of Portland may establish
best value standards and criteria, taking into account factors that include:

16 (1) Experience, technical capability and past performance.

(2) The qualifications, compensation and retention policies of bidding contractors and
lessees with respect to the staff and subcontractors operating at the port.

(3) Potential local and regional benefit within the port, the surrounding community, the
region and the state.
