House Bill 3346

Sponsored by Representative HOYLE (at the request of Dean Skiller)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Provides that State Fish and Wildlife Commission may not require that person possess hunting license to apply for controlled hunt tag or permit.

Provides that person who receives controlled hunt tag or permit does not need hunting license to hunt in controlled hunt that corresponds to tag or permit.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to controlled hunts; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The State Fish and Wildlife Commission may not require by rule that a 5 person possess a hunting license to apply for a controlled hunt tag or permit.

6 (2) A person who receives a controlled hunt tag or permit does not need a hunting license

7 to hunt in the controlled hunt that corresponds to that tag or permit.

8 (3) The State Fish and Wildlife Commission shall adopt rules to carry out the provisions
9 of this section.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, section 1 of this 2013
 Act becomes operative on January 1, 2014.

(2) The State Fish and Wildlife Commission may adopt rules or take any other action
before the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section that is necessary to implement, on and after the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section, section 1
of this 2013 Act.

16 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 17 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect 18 on its passage.
