House Bill 3378

Sponsored by Representative PARRISH; Representative THOMPSON

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Requires health benefit plans provided by Public Employees' Benefit Board and Oregon Educators Benefit Board to provide telemedicine services to eligible employees.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

- 2 Relating to provision of telemedicine services by certain benefit plans; and declaring an emergency.
- 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2013 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 243.105 to 243.285.
 - <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) All contracts for a health benefit plan entered into by the Public Employees' Benefit Board must allow for the provision of telemedicine services to eligible employees.
 - (2) As used in this section, "telemedicine" means the delivery of health care in the form of assessment, diagnosis, treatment, consultation, transfer and interpretation of medical data and patient education by a telemedicine provider directly to a patient through audio, video, data transfer or other electronic means.
 - SECTION 3. Section 4 of this 2013 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 243.860 to 243.886.
 - <u>SECTION 4.</u> (1) All contracts for a health benefit plan entered into by the Oregon Educators Benefit Board must allow for the provision of telemedicine services to eligible employees.
 - (2) As used in this section, "telemedicine" means the delivery of health care in the form of assessment, diagnosis, treatment, consultation, transfer and interpretation of medical data and patient education by a telemedicine provider directly to a patient through audio, video, data transfer or other electronic means.
 - SECTION 5. Sections 2 and 4 of this 2013 Act apply to contracts for health benefit plans entered into on or after the effective date of this 2013 Act.
 - <u>SECTION 6.</u> This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect on its passage.
