**SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Directs [*Governor's budget report submitted to Legislative Assembly to describe, for each state agency,*] **state agencies to include on Oregon transparency website description of percentage of expenditures made in Oregon and percentage of expenditures made outside Oregon during each biennium** by agency under contracts for goods or services.

**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

2 Relating to reporting of expenditures made under state contracts; creating new provisions; and  
3 amending ORS 184.483.

4 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 184.483 is amended to read:

6 184.483. (1) The Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall develop and make available  
7 an Oregon transparency website. The website shall allow any person to view information that is a  
8 public record and not exempt from disclosure under ORS 192.410 to 192.505, including but not lim-  
9 ited to information described in subsection (3) of this section.

10 (2) State agencies and education service districts, to the extent practicable and subject to laws  
11 relating to confidentiality, when at no additional cost, using existing data and existing resources of  
12 the state agency or education service district and without reallocation of resources, shall:

13 (a) Furnish information to the Oregon transparency website by posting reports and providing  
14 links to existing information system applications in accordance with standards established by the  
15 Oregon Department of Administrative Services; and

16 (b) Provide the information in the format and manner required by the Oregon Department of  
17 Administrative Services.

18 (3) To the extent practicable and subject to laws relating to confidentiality, when at no addi-  
19 tional cost, using existing data and existing resources of the state agency or education service dis-  
20 trict and without reallocation of resources, the Oregon transparency website shall contain  
21 information about each state agency and education service district, including but not limited to:

22 (a) Annual revenues of state agencies and education service districts;

23 (b) Annual expenditures of state agencies and education service districts;

24 (c) Annual human resources expenses, including compensation, of state agencies and education  
25 service districts;

26 (d) Annual tax expenditures of state agencies, including, when possible, the identity of the re-

1 cipients of each tax expenditure;

2 (e) Contracting and subcontracting information of state agencies and education service districts,  
3 to the extent allowed by law, **including, for each state agency, a description of the percentage**  
4 **of expenditures made in this state and the percentage of expenditures made outside this**  
5 **state under all contracts for goods or services entered into by the state agency during each**  
6 **biennium;**

7 (f) A prominently placed graphic representation of the primary funding categories and approxi-  
8 mate number of individuals served by the state agency or the education service district;

9 (g) A description of the mission, function and program categories of the state agency or educa-  
10 tion service district;

11 (h) Information about the state agency from the Oregon Progress Board;

12 (i) A copy of any audit report issued by the Secretary of State for the state agency or of any  
13 audit reports issued for the education service district;

14 (j) The local service plans of the education service districts;

15 (k) A copy of each report required by statute for education service districts; and

16 (L) A copy of all notices of public meetings of the education service districts.

17 (4) In addition to the information described in subsection (3) of this section, each state agency  
18 shall post on the Oregon transparency website notices of public meetings required to be provided  
19 by the state agency under ORS 192.640.

20 (5) In creating, operating, refining and recommending enhancements to the Oregon transparency  
21 website, the Oregon Department of Administrative Services and the Transparency Oregon Advisory  
22 Commission created in ORS 184.486 shall consider and, to the extent practicable, adhere to the fol-  
23 lowing principles:

24 (a) The website must be accessible without cost and be easy to use;

25 (b) Information included on the Oregon transparency website must be presented using plain,  
26 easily understandable language; and

27 (c) The website should teach users about how state government and education service districts  
28 work and provide users with the opportunity to learn something about how state government and  
29 education service districts raise and spend revenue.

30 (6) If a state agency or an education service district is not able to include information described  
31 in this section on the Oregon transparency website because of the lack of availability of information  
32 or cost in acquiring it, the Transparency Oregon Advisory Commission created in ORS 184.486 shall  
33 list the information that is not included for that state agency or education service district in the  
34 commission's report to the Legislative Assembly required under ORS 184.486.

35 **SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 184.483 by section 1 of this 2013 Act apply to**  
36 **expenditures made under contracts for goods and services entered into by state agencies**  
37 **during biennia beginning on or after July 1, 2013.**

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
