

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 3403

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after “buildings” delete the rest of the line and line 3 and
2 insert “; and declaring an emergency.”.

3 Delete lines 5 through 31 and delete page 2 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1. (1) The Healthy Vending Task Force is established, consisting of 15 mem-**
5 **bers appointed as follows:**

6 **“(a) The President of the Senate shall appoint one member from among members of the**
7 **Senate.**

8 **“(b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint one member from among**
9 **members of the House of Representatives.**

10 **“(c) The Director of the Oregon Health Authority shall appoint the following 13 members:**

11 **“(A) One member who represents the Oregon Health Authority Public Health Division;**

12 **“(B) One member who represents the Commission for the Blind;**

13 **“(C) One member who represents the Commission for the Blind Business Enterprise**
14 **Program;**

15 **“(D) One member who represents the Commission for the Blind Business Enterprise**
16 **Consumer Committee of Oregon;**

17 **“(E) One member who represents the vending machine industry;**

18 **“(F) One member who represents the Public Employees’ Benefit Board;**

19 **“(G) One member who represents labor organizations that represent public employees;**

20 **“(H) One member who represents the Oregon Department of Administrative Services;**

21 **“(I) One member who represents the office of the Governor;**

22 **“(J) One member who represents public health advocacy organizations;**

23 **“(K) One member who represents the interests of local governments as those interests**
24 **relate to healthy food and beverage vending machine programs in public buildings;**

25 **“(L) One member who is a registered dietitian; and**

26 **“(M) One member of the public.**

27 **“(2) The task force shall:**

28 **“(a) Explore current local and state initiatives to promote and evaluate government-**
29 **based, work site nutrition initiatives, including work led by the Public Employees’ Benefit**
30 **Board;**

31 **“(b) Review evidence-based research on the nutritional standards for current programs**
32 **for offering healthy food and beverage vending machine programs in public buildings;**

33 **“(c) Study the current practices and economics of food and beverage vending machine**
34 **programs in public buildings;**

35 **“(d) Review studies from previous efforts by the Commission for the Blind Business En-**

1 **terprise Program and by state and local jurisdictions that have passed healthy vending ma-**
2 **chine regulations to learn about the challenges to, barriers to and successes in implementing**
3 **healthy food and beverage vending machine programs in public buildings;**

4 **“(e) Explore strategies for increasing the sales of healthy food and beverages in vending**
5 **machines that may include, but not be limited to, gathering public employee input, developing**
6 **marketing and promotional materials, developing appropriate pricing for products and re-**
7 **searching strategic placement of products in vending machines;**

8 **“(f) Explore the training and technical assistance that may be necessary to support**
9 **Commission for the Blind Business Enterprise Program vendors and local and state govern-**
10 **ment agencies in transitioning to offering healthy food and beverage vending machine pro-**
11 **grams in public buildings; and**

12 **“(g) Research funding strategies and identify sources of funding to provide training,**
13 **transitional support, marketing and promotional support, subsidies and incentives to assist**
14 **in the implementation of pilot programs or full-scale programs for offering healthy food and**
15 **beverage vending machine programs in public buildings.**

16 **“(3) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the trans-**
17 **action of business.**

18 **“(4) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the members**
19 **of the task force.**

20 **“(5) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.**

21 **“(6) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appoint-**
22 **ment to become immediately effective.**

23 **“(7) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson**
24 **or of a majority of the members of the task force.**

25 **“(8) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.**

26 **“(9) The task force shall submit to the Legislative Assembly, in the manner provided by**
27 **ORS 192.245, a progress report that may include recommendations for legislation, no later**
28 **than December 15, 2013. The task force shall submit to the Legislative Assembly, no later**
29 **than September 1, 2014, a final report that may include recommendations on issues including,**
30 **but not limited to, nutrition standards for food and beverages offered in vending machines**
31 **in public buildings, contract stipulations for vending machine programs and opportunities for**
32 **the use of funds from the Public Employees’ Benefit Board and other sources to support**
33 **healthy food and beverage vending machine programs in public buildings.**

34 **“(10) The Oregon Health Authority shall provide staff support to the task force.**

35 **“(11) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are**
36 **not entitled to compensation, but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary travel and**
37 **other expenses incurred by them in the performance of their official duties in the manner**
38 **and amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. Claims for expenses incurred in performing func-**
39 **tions of the task force shall be paid out of funds appropriated to the authority for purposes**
40 **of the task force.**

41 **“(12) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist**
42 **the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating**
43 **to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force**
44 **consider necessary to perform their duties.**

45 **“SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2013 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the**

1 2015 regular session of the Legislative Assembly as specified in ORS 171.010.

2 “SECTION 3. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
3 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect
4 on its passage.”.

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
