## House Bill 3509

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Authorizes counties to regulate location of sex offender treatment facilities. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

1	A BILL FOR AN ACT
2	Relating to sex offender treatment; and declaring an emergency.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. (1) The governing body of a county may, by ordinance, regulate the location
5	of treatment facilities for sex offenders.
6	(2) When adopting an ordinance under this section, the governing body of a county shall
7	consider:
8	(a) The location of the treatment facility in relation to schools, day care facilities, agen-
9	cies that provide services to children and other areas where children regularly congregate;
10	(b) The zoning classification that is appropriate for the location of a treatment facility
11	for sex offenders;
12	(c) The location of the treatment facility in relation to businesses where pornography is
13	sold or nude dancing is performed;
14	(d) The number of sex offenders that will be treated at the facility; and
15	(e) Whether any sex offenders designated as sexually violent dangerous offenders, as de-
16	fined in ORS 137.765, or predatory sex offenders, as defined in ORS 181.585, will be treated
17	at the facility.
18	(3) As used in this section, the term "sex offender" has the meaning given that term in
19	ORS 675.365.
20	SECTION 2. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
