House Bill 5014

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Presession filed (at the request of Oregon Department of Administrative Services)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to State Department of Geology and Mineral Industries for biennial expenses.

Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and specified federal funds, but excluding lottery funds and other federal funds, collected or received by department.

Limits biennial expenditures by department from other federal funds. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2013.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to the financial administration of the State Department of Geology and Mineral Industries;

3 appropriating money; limiting expenditures; and declaring an emergency.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 <u>SECTION 1.</u> There is appropriated to the State Department of Geology and Mineral In-6 dustries, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, out of the General Fund, the amount of

7 \$2,575,953 for operations of the department.

8 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of 9 \$7,848,295 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, as the maximum limit for 10 payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts 11 and federal funds for contract services, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not 12 described in this section, collected or received by the State Department of Geology and 13 Mineral Industries.

SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$4,308,092 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds, other than those described in section 2 of this 2013 Act, collected or received by the State Department of Geology and Mineral Industries.

18 <u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 19 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect 20 July 1, 2013.
