SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.
Appropriates moneys from General Fund to [] Higher Education Coordinating Commission for biennial expenses. Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by [] commission .
Limits biennial expenditures of [] commission from federal funds. Authorizes specified nonlimited expenditures. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2013.
A BILL FOR AN ACT
Relating to state financial administration; appropriating money; limiting expenditures; and declaring
an emergency.
Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
SECTION 1. There is appropriated to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission, for
the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$2,297,824.
SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
\$1,736,759 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, as the maximum limit for
payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts,
but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Higher Education
Coordinating Commission.
SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$342,759
is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, as the maximum limit for payment of
expenses from federal funds collected or received by the Higher Education Coordinating
Commission.
SECTION 4. For the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, expenditures by the Higher Educa-
tion Coordinating Commission from the Tuition Protection Fund established under ORS
345.110 are not limited.
SECTION 5. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect
July 1, 2013.
