## **House Concurrent Resolution 23**

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Recognizes service and sacrifices of atomic veterans.

2	whereas the United States government engaged in atmospheric and underwater nuclear weap-
3	ons testing from July 16, 1945, to November 4, 1962, exposing nearly 200,000 United States military
4	service members to unsafe levels of radiation; and
5	Whereas service members exposed to ionizing radiation due to participation in nuclear weapons
6	testing became known as atomic veterans; and
7	Whereas atomic veterans were unable to discuss the nuclear weapons tests until the tests were
8	declassified many years later; and
9	Whereas many atomic veterans died before they were able to seek veterans' benefits for their
10	exposure to ionizing radiation; and
11	Whereas the United States Department of Veterans Affairs has identified more than 20 cancers
12	and diseases associated with radiation exposure experienced by atomic veterans; and
13	Whereas many atomic veterans were exposed without their knowledge, their consent or any
14	subsequent disclosure; and
15	Whereas atomic veterans served their country honorably and with distinction, dedication and
16	self-sacrifice for the freedom of others; now, therefore,
17	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
18	That we, the members of the Seventy-seventh Legislative Assembly, honor and recognize the
19	selfless service and dedication of atomic veterans for their country.

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
