## **House Concurrent Resolution 26**

Sponsored by Representatives WHISNANT, BOONE, BARTON, Senator THOMSEN

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Urges Oregonians to ensure that all families have means to raise their children in healthy environment.

2	Whereas there were nearly 75,000 reports and more than 11,500 victims of child abuse and
3	neglect in Oregon in 2011; and
4	Whereas we all have a responsibility as individuals, neighbors, community members and resi-
<b>5</b>	dents of the State of Oregon to help create a healthy, safe and nurturing environment for children;

7	Whereas a safe and healthy childhood gives an individual a better chance to be a confident and
8	successful adult; and
9	Whereas child abuse and neglect often occur when people find themselves in stressful situations,
10	without access to support resources in the community, and are unable to cope; and
11	Whereas many child abuse and neglect cases stem from situations and conditions that are
12	preventable with the support of an engaged community; and
13	Whereas child abuse and neglect can be reduced by making sure that families have the support
14	and access to services they need to raise their children in a healthy environment; and
15	Whereas child abuse and neglect not only directly harm children but also lead to trauma that
16	can increase the likelihood of criminal behavior, substance abuse, health problems such as heart
17	disease and obesity and poor academic performance; and
18	Whereas effective prevention programs succeed because of partnerships among agencies,
19	schools, faith communities, philanthropic and civic organizations, law enforcement agencies and the
20	business community; and
21	Whereas the purchase of Keep Kids Safe vehicle registration plates provides a sustainable
22	source of revenue for all counties in Oregon to invest in effective child abuse prevention programs;

24	Whereas April is National Child Abuse Prevention Month; now, therefore,
25	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
26	That we, the members of the Seventy-seventh Legislative Assembly, urge all Oregonians to work
27	together to support programs and build communities that ensure that all families have the means
28	to raise their children in a healthy environment.
