Whereas Lynn Lundquist was born on November 3, 1934, in Portland, Oregon; and

Whereas Lynn Lundquist is remembered by his family as a thoughtful, diligent, compassionate family man whose faith served as his compass throughout his life; and

Whereas Lynn Lundquist is remembered by his many friends as a people person who was always ready to lend a hand without being asked; and

Whereas Lynn Lundquist had a broad smile, limitless energy, a sense of humor and quiet forethought, and was a tireless advocate for his community; and

Whereas a friend once observed that Lynn Lundquist “lived a renaissance life: He was a politician, a farmer, a government official and a businessman, he did it all. In this age when we are all becoming specialists, he was maybe the last generalist.”; and

Whereas Lynn Lundquist was a graduate of Oregon State University and held a master’s degree from the University of Connecticut; and

Whereas Lynn Lundquist was a professor of economics at George Fox University and a former member of the Newberg School Board; and

Whereas Lynn Lundquist served on the board of directors of Special Olympics Oregon, CareOregon and the Children’s Institute, on the Yamhill County Budget Committee and as a member of the American Leadership Council and was elected as a Crook County Commissioner; and

Whereas Lynn Lundquist was a 4-H leader and served as state president for the Oregon Future Farmers of America Association, as president of the Oregon Cattlemen’s Association and on the State Board of Agriculture; and

Whereas Lynn Lundquist was elected to the Oregon Legislative Assembly, serving from 1995 to 2001, and was elected Speaker of the House of Representatives in 1997; and

Whereas Lynn Lundquist was the first president of the Oregon Business Association, serving from 2000 to 2007; and

Whereas as president of the Oregon Business Association, Lynn Lundquist pursued his belief that bipartisanship was the way to build a stronger Oregon, receiving for his efforts the Statesman of the Year Award in 2008; and

Whereas Lynn Lundquist was an advocate for children and for education, working to establish a benchmark for measuring the costs of providing quality education in Oregon; and

Whereas Lynn Lundquist died unexpectedly on April 9, 2013, at the age of 78, while at his ranch in Powell Butte, Oregon, in the arms of Barbara, his wife of 42 years; and

Whereas Lynn Lundquist leaves behind seven children and many grandchildren, as well as a legacy of public service and commitment to the State of Oregon; now, therefore,

Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:

That we, the members of the Seventy-seventh Legislative Assembly, honor Speaker Lynn Lundquist for his leadership and his invaluable contributions to the State of Oregon and its residents.
