House Joint Resolution 10

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Presession filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Revenue)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to allow bills for raising revenue to pass with simple majority of both houses.

Refers proposed amendment to people for their approval or rejection at next regular general election.

1	JOINT RESOLUTION
2	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
3	PARAGRAPH 1. Section 25, Article IV of the Constitution of the State of Oregon, is amended
4	to read:
5	Sec. 25. (1) [Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2) of this section, a] A majority of all the
6	members elected to each [House] house shall be necessary to pass every bill or [Joint] joint resol-
7	ution.
8	[(2) Three-fifths of all members elected to each House shall be necessary to pass bills for raising
9	revenue.]
10	[(3)] (2) All bills, and [Joint] joint resolutions passed, shall be signed by the presiding officers
11	of the respective houses.

13	PARAGRAPH 2. The amendment proposed by this resolution shall be submitted to the
14	people for their approval or rejection at the next regular general election held throughout
15	this state.
