SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to include providing services to veterans among public purposes for which net proceeds of Oregon State Lottery may be spent.

Refers proposed amendment to people for their approval or rejection at next regular general election.

JOINT RESOLUTION

Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:

PARAGRAPH 1. Section 4, Article XV of the Constitution of the State of Oregon, is amended to read:

Sec. 4. (1) Except as provided in subsections (2), (3), (4), (8), **(9) and (10)** [*and (9)*] of this section, lotteries and the sale of lottery tickets, for any purpose whatever, are prohibited, and the Legislative Assembly shall prevent the same by penal laws.

(2) The Legislative Assembly may provide for the establishment, operation, and regulation of raffles and the lottery commonly known as bingo or lotto by charitable, fraternal, or religious organizations. As used in this section, charitable, fraternal or religious organization means such organizations or foundations as defined by law because of their charitable, fraternal, or religious purposes. The regulations shall define eligible organizations or foundations, and may prescribe the frequency of raffles, bingo or lotto, set a maximum monetary limit for prizes and require a statement of the odds on winning a prize. The Legislative Assembly shall vest the regulatory authority in any appropriate state agency.

(3) There is hereby created the State Lottery Commission which shall establish and operate a State Lottery. All proceeds from the State Lottery, including interest, but excluding costs of administration and payment of prizes, shall be used for any of the following purposes: [*creating jobs, furthering economic development, financing public education in Oregon or restoring and protecting Oregon's parks, beaches, watersheds and native fish and wildlife.*]

(a) Creating jobs;

(b) Furthering economic development;

(c) Financing public education in Oregon;

NOTE: Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter [*italic and bracketed*] is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

1 **(d) Restoring and protecting Oregon’s parks, beaches, watersheds and native fish and**
2 **wildlife; or**

3 **(e) Providing services for veterans, including but not limited to:**

4 **(A) Assistance with reintegration, employment, education benefits and tuition, housing,**
5 **health care, including mental health care, and access to state and federal benefits for vet-**
6 **erans, their spouses and their dependents; and**

7 **(B) Services provided by county veterans’ service officers or campus veterans’ service**
8 **officers.**

9 (4)(a) The State Lottery Commission shall be [*comprised*] **composed** of five members appointed
10 by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate who shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor. At
11 least one of the Commissioners shall have a minimum of five years experience in law enforcement
12 and at least one of the Commissioners shall be a certified public accountant. The Commission is
13 empowered to promulgate rules related to the procedures of the Commission and the operation of
14 the State Lottery. Such rules and any statutes enacted to further implement this article shall
15 [*insure*] **ensure** the integrity, security, honesty, and fairness of the Lottery. The Commission shall
16 have such additional powers and duties as may be provided by law.

17 (b) The Governor shall appoint a Director subject to confirmation by the Senate who shall serve
18 at the pleasure of the Governor. The Director shall be qualified by training and experience to direct
19 the operations of a state-operated lottery. The Director shall be responsible for managing the affairs
20 of the Commission. The Director may appoint and prescribe the duties of no more than four Assist-
21 ant Directors as the Director deems necessary. One of the Assistant Directors shall be responsible
22 for a security division to [*assure*] **ensure** security, integrity, honesty, and fairness in the operations
23 and administration of the State Lottery. To fulfill these responsibilities, the Assistant Director for
24 security shall be qualified by training and experience, including at least five years of law enforce-
25 ment experience, and knowledge and experience in computer security.

26 (c) The Director shall implement and operate a State Lottery pursuant to the rules, and under
27 the guidance, of the Commission. The State Lottery may operate any game procedure authorized
28 by the commission, except parimutuel racing, social games, and the games commonly known in
29 Oregon as bingo or lotto, whereby prizes are distributed using any existing or future methods among
30 adult persons who have paid for tickets or shares in that game; provided that, in lottery games
31 utilizing computer terminals or other devices, no coins or currency shall ever be dispensed directly
32 to players from such computer terminals or devices.

33 (d) There is hereby created within the General Fund the Oregon State Lottery Fund which is
34 continuously appropriated for the purpose of administering and operating the Commission and the
35 State Lottery. The State Lottery shall operate as a self-supporting revenue-raising agency of state
36 government and no appropriations, loans, or other transfers of state funds shall be made to it. The
37 State Lottery shall pay all prizes and all of its expenses out of the revenues it receives from the sale
38 of tickets or shares to the public and [*turnover*] **turn over** the net proceeds therefrom to a fund to
39 be established by the Legislative Assembly from which the Legislative Assembly shall make appro-
40 priations for the benefit of any of the following public purposes: [*creating jobs, furthering economic*
41 *development, financing public education in Oregon or restoring and protecting Oregon’s parks, beaches,*
42 *watersheds and native fish and wildlife.*]

43 **(A) Creating jobs;**

44 **(B) Furthering economic development;**

45 **(C) Financing public education in Oregon;**

1 **(D) Restoring and protecting Oregon’s parks, beaches, watersheds and native fish and**
2 **wildlife; or**

3 **(E) Providing services for veterans, including but not limited to:**

4 **(i) Assistance with reintegration, employment, education benefits and tuition, housing,**
5 **health care, including mental health care, and access to state and federal benefits for vet-**
6 **erans, their spouses and their dependents; and**

7 **(ii) Services provided by county veterans’ service officers or campus veterans’ service**
8 **officers.**

9 **(e)** Effective July 1, 1997, [15%] **15 percent** of the net proceeds from the State Lottery shall be
10 deposited, from the fund created by the Legislative Assembly under [this paragraph] **paragraph (d)**
11 **of this subsection**, in an education stability fund. Effective July 1, 2003, [18%] **18 percent** of the
12 net proceeds from the State Lottery shall be deposited, from the fund created by the Legislative
13 Assembly under [this paragraph] **paragraph (d) of this subsection**, in an education stability fund.
14 Earnings on moneys in the education stability fund shall be retained in the fund or expended for the
15 public purpose of financing public education in Oregon as provided by law. Except as provided in
16 subsection (6) of this section, moneys in the education stability fund shall be invested as provided
17 by law and shall not be subject to the limitations of section 6, Article XI of this Constitution. The
18 Legislative Assembly may appropriate other moneys or revenue to the education stability fund. The
19 Legislative Assembly shall appropriate amounts sufficient to pay lottery bonds before appropriating
20 the net proceeds from the State Lottery for any other purpose. At least [84%] **84 percent** of the
21 total annual revenues from the sale of all lottery tickets or shares shall be returned to the public
22 in the form of prizes and net revenues benefiting the public purpose.

23 (5) Notwithstanding paragraph [(d)] **(e)** of subsection (4) of this section, the amount in the edu-
24 cation stability fund created under paragraph [(d)] **(e)** of subsection (4) of this section may not ex-
25 ceed an amount that is equal to five percent of the amount that was accrued as revenues in the
26 state’s General Fund during the prior biennium. If the amount in the education stability fund ex-
27 ceeds five percent of the amount that was accrued as revenues in the state’s General Fund during
28 the prior biennium:

29 (a) Additional net proceeds from the State Lottery may not be deposited in the education sta-
30 bility fund until the amount in the education stability fund is reduced to less than five percent of
31 the amount that was accrued as revenues in the state’s General Fund during the prior biennium;
32 and

33 (b) Fifteen percent of the net proceeds from the State Lottery shall be deposited, **from the fund**
34 **created by the Legislative Assembly under paragraph (d) of subsection (4) of this section**, into
35 the school capital matching fund created under section 4, Article XI-P of this Constitution.

36 (6) The Legislative Assembly may by law appropriate, allocate or transfer any portion of the
37 principal of the education stability fund created under paragraph [(d)] **(e)** of subsection (4) of this
38 section for expenditure on public education if:

39 (a) The proposed appropriation, allocation or transfer is approved by three-fifths of the members
40 serving in each house of the Legislative Assembly and the Legislative Assembly finds one of the
41 following:

42 (A) That the last quarterly economic and revenue forecast for a biennium indicates that moneys
43 available to the state’s General Fund for the next biennium will be at least three percent less than
44 appropriations from the state’s General Fund for the current biennium;

45 (B) That there has been a decline for two or more consecutive quarters in the last 12 months

1 in seasonally adjusted nonfarm payroll employment; or

2 (C) That a quarterly economic and revenue forecast projects that revenues in the state's General
3 Fund in the current biennium will be at least two percent below what the revenues were projected
4 to be in the revenue forecast on which the legislatively adopted budget for the current biennium
5 was based; or

6 (b) The proposed appropriation, allocation or transfer is approved by three-fifths of the members
7 serving in each house of the Legislative Assembly and the Governor declares an emergency.

8 (7) The Legislative Assembly may by law prescribe the procedures to be used and identify the
9 persons required to make the forecasts described in subsection (6) of this section.

10 (8) Effective July 1, 1999, [15%] **15 percent** of the net proceeds from the State Lottery shall be
11 deposited, **from the fund created by the Legislative Assembly under paragraph (d) of sub-**
12 **section (4) of this section**, in a parks and natural resources fund created by the Legislative As-
13 sembly. Of the moneys in the parks and natural resources fund, [50%] **50 percent** shall be deposited
14 in a parks subaccount and distributed for the public purposes of financing the protection, repair,
15 operation, and creation of state, regional and local public parks, ocean shore and public beach ac-
16 cess areas, historic sites and recreation areas, and [50%] **50 percent** shall be deposited in a natural
17 resources subaccount and distributed for the public purposes of financing the restoration and pro-
18 tection of native fish and wildlife, watersheds and water quality in Oregon. The Legislative Assem-
19 bly shall not limit expenditures from the parks and natural resources fund, or from the parks or
20 natural resources subaccounts. The Legislative Assembly may appropriate other moneys or revenue
21 to the parks and natural resources fund.

22 (9) **Effective July 1, 2015, one percent of the net proceeds from the State Lottery shall**
23 **be deposited, from the fund created by the Legislative Assembly under paragraph (d) of**
24 **subsection (4) of this section, in a veterans' services lottery fund created by the Legislative**
25 **Assembly. Earnings on moneys in the veterans' services lottery fund shall be retained in the**
26 **fund or expended for the public purpose described in paragraph (e) of subsection (3) of this**
27 **section as provided by law. The Legislative Assembly may appropriate other moneys or re-**
28 **venue to the veterans' services lottery fund. The state agency to which moneys in the**
29 **veterans' services lottery fund are allocated shall use the moneys to make grants and loans,**
30 **and to provide services directly, for the public purposes described in paragraph (e) of sub-**
31 **section (3) of this section.**

32 [(9)] (10) Only one State Lottery operation shall be permitted in the State.

33 [(10)] (11) The Legislative Assembly has no power to authorize, and shall prohibit, casinos from
34 operation in the State of Oregon.

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36 **PARAGRAPH 2. The amendment proposed by this resolution shall be submitted to the**
37 **people for their approval or rejection at the next regular general election held throughout**
38 **this state.**
