## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Requires Oregon Health Authority to work with coordinated care organizations and stakeholders to develop recommendations to Legislative Assembly for advancing use of health information technology.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

2	Relating to health information technology; and declaring an emergency.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. (1) The Oregon Health Authority shall work with coordinated care organ-
5	izations and other stakeholders to develop recommendations for advancing the use of health
6	information technology.
7	(2) The authority shall report its recommendations to the Legislative Assembly in the
8	manner provided in ORS 192.245 no later than January 1, 2015.
9	SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2013 Act is repealed January 2, 2015.
10	SECTION 3. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
11	peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect
12	on its passage.
