The Oregon Health Authority shall report in the manner described in ORS 3 192.245 to the regular session of the Legislative Assembly not later than February 1, 2015, 4 $\mathbf{5}$ the following: 6 "(1) The burden of diabetes in this state as measured by: 7 "(a) The estimated prevalence of diagnosed and undiagnosed adult diabetes and, for diagnosed diabetes, the estimated prevalence by age, race and sex; 8 9 (b) The estimated prevalence of prediabetes and of diagnosed Type I diabetes, Type II 10 diabetes and gestational diabetes; 11 "(c) The number of hospitalizations and the estimated cost of hospitalizations due to 12diabetes and due to heart disease in patients diagnosed with diabetes; 13 "(d) The estimated costs of hospitalizations for diabetes compared to hospitalizations for 14 other common chronic diseases; 15"(e) The National Quality Forum Measure 59, HbA1c Poor Control, publicly reported for 16 coordinated care organizations, including the baseline measurements and all available quar-17 terly data; 18 "(f) The estimated prevalence of obesity and overweight in the most recent year for 19 which data are readily available; 20 "(g) The estimated direct and indirect costs of diabetes in the most recent year for which 21data are readily available; 22(h) The estimated prevalence of diabetes among participants in Medicaid-funded state 23programs; 24 "(i) The direct claims costs of diabetes to Medicaid-funded state programs; 25(j) The estimated prevalence of diabetes among enrollees in health benefit plans offered by the Public Employees' Benefit Board; 2627"(k) The direct claims costs to the Public Employees' Benefit Board for treating diabetes 28and diabetes-related complications; 29"(L) The estimated prevalence of diabetes among enrollees in health benefit plans offered by the Oregon Educators Benefit Board; and 30 31 "(m) The direct claims costs to the Oregon Educators Benefit Board for treating diabetes 32and diabetes-related complications. "(2) The status of: 33 34 "(a) The strategic plan to start to slow the rate of diabetes caused by obesity and other 35environmental factors by the year 2010 that was developed in accordance with section 2, chapter 460, Oregon Laws 2007 (Enrolled House Bill 3486), including the authority's current
 funding recommendations to complete the implementation of the plan; and

3 "(b) Other strategies developed by the authority to reduce the impact of prediabetes,

diabetes and diabetes-related complications including strategies to reduce hospitalizations
 and improve diabetes care for participants in state-funded health programs.

6 "<u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2013 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the
7 2016 regular session of the Legislative Assembly.

8 "SECTION 3. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 9 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect 10 on its passage.".

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
