77th OREGON LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY--2013 Regular Session

## Senate Bill 176

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## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Creates Oregon Task Force on Jobs and the Economy. Sunsets task force on date of convening of 2015 regular session of Legislative Assembly. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT 1 Relating to economic development; and declaring an emergency. 2 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 3 SECTION 1. (1) The Oregon Task Force on Jobs and the Economy is established, con-4 sisting of 10 members appointed as follows: 5 (a) The President of the Senate shall appoint two members from among members of the 6 7 Senate. (b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint two members from among 8 9 members of the House of Representatives. 10 (c) The Governor shall appoint four members representing Oregon businesses. (d) The Director of the Oregon Business Development Department shall appoint one 11 member to represent the department. 12 13 (e) The Director of the Employment Department shall appoint one member to represent the department. 14 (2) The task force shall study, consider and make recommendations to expand Oregon's 15 economy and opportunities for employment in this state. 16 (3) The task force may hold hearings and take testimony regarding issues and concerns 17 related to its functions and duties under subsection (2) of this section. 18 (4) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction 19 20 of business. (5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the members 21 22 of the task force. (6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson. 2324 (7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appointment to become immediately effective. 2526 (8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson

(10) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to the interim or regular committees of the

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1 Legislative Assembly related to business and economic development and job creation, as ap-

2 propriate, no later than October 1, 2014.

3 (11) The Oregon Business Development Department shall provide staff support to the
4 task force.

5 (12) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are not 6 entitled to compensation, but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary travel and other 7 expenses incurred by them in the performance of their official duties in the manner and 8 amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. Claims for expenses incurred in performing functions 9 of the task force shall be paid out of funds appropriated to the Oregon Business Development 10 Department for purposes of the task force.

(13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force consider necessary to perform their duties.

15 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2013 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the 2015
16 regular session of the Legislative Assembly as specified in ORS 171.010.

17 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 18 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect 19 on its passage.

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
