# Senate Bill 208

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#### SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Allows applicant enrolled in senior year of curriculum approved by State Board of Examiners for Engineering and Land Surveying to take fundamentals of engineering examination or fundamen-tals of land surveying examination. Requires applicant to furnish board with proof of successful completion of curriculum. Allows board to administer examinations that are computer-based.

Allows board to consider education of applicant for licensing as land surveyor as relevant factor in lieu of degree. Revises position title of board secretary.

#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to the State Board of Examiners for Engineering and Land Surveying; creating new pro-2

visions; and amending ORS 672.090, 672.102, 672.105, 672.115, 672.118, 672.141, 672.151, 672.170 3 and 672.255. 4

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 $\mathbf{5}$ Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2013 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 672.002 to 6 672.325. 7

SECTION 2. (1) Notwithstanding ORS 670.010, 672.105 and 672.118 the State Board of Ex-8 aminers for Engineering and Land Surveying may waive the educational requirement for 9 admission to the fundamentals of engineering examination or the fundamentals of land sur-10 11 veying examination if an applicant furnishes evidence satisfactory to the board that the ap-12 plicant is currently enrolled in the senior year of a curriculum approved by the board.

13 (2) An applicant who is admitted to an examination under a waiver described in sub-14 section (1) of this section shall, within a time specified by the board by rule, provide the board with an official transcript showing that the applicant has successfully completed the 1516 board-approved curriculum. Failure of the applicant to timely provide the board with an of-17 ficial transcript showing that the applicant has successfully completed the curriculum vacates any passing score that the applicant achieved on an examination to which the applicant 18 was admitted under the waiver. 19

20 (3) The board may not refund any part of an application fee, examination fee or other fee paid by an applicant described in subsection (2) of this section who fails to timely provide the 21board with an official transcript as required by board rule. 22

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(2) Examinations shall be held at such times and at such places in each year as the board shall 1 2 determine. The scope of the examinations and the methods of procedure shall be prescribed by the 3 board. Examinations for registration may be written or [oral, or both] computer-based. SECTION 4. 11	(A) Meets the minimum qualifications established under ORS 672.105 for taking the fundamentals
12	[ <i>in</i> ] <b>of</b> engineering examination;
13	(B) Within five years prior to the application date, has taken a standardized fundamentals of
14	engineering examination and a practical engineer's examination that were administered by a na-
15	tional organization recognized by the board;
16	(C) Satisfactorily passed the standardized fundamentals of engineering examination and practical
17	engineer's examination in all subjects required by law or board rule; and
18	(D) Has a work record of four years or more of active practice in engineering work satisfactory

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(C) Satisfactorily passed the standardized fundamentals of land surveying examination and the

professional photogrammetric mapping examination in all subjects required by law or board rule; (D) Has four or more years of experience acceptable to the board as an active practitioner of photogrammetric mapping; (b) Pays the required fee; and (c) Meets any other requirements established under ORS 672.002 to 672.325 or board rules for registration as a photogrammetrist. (4) The board may refuse to issue a registration under this section to an applicant who has been found to have violated ethical or professional standards by a court or administrative body in another state for committing or omitting acts that, if committed or omitted in this state, would be a violation of ethical or professional standards established under ORS 672.002 to 672.325. SECTION 9. ORS 672.151 is amended to read: 672.151. As soon as practicable after the close of each examination, the [secretary] administrator of the State Board of Examiners for Engineering and Land Surveying shall notify each candidate of the result of the candidate's examination. SECTION 10. ORS 672.170 is amended to read: 672.170. (1) Renewal of a certificate may be effected at any time prior to the renewal date by paying the required renewal fee to [the secretary of] the State Board of Examiners for Engineering and Land Surveying. (2) Subject to subsection (4) of this section, the failure of a registrant to renew the certificate before the renewal date does not deprive the registrant of the right of renewal thereafter. (3) The amount to be paid for the renewal of a certificate after the renewal date shall be the renewal fee plus a late-payment charge determined by the board. (4) A certificate may not be renewed if the certificate has been retired for more than five years or delinquent for more than five years.

(a) Establishing fees as provided in ORS 672.155 and late-payment charges under ORS 672.170. 29

30 (b) Providing a procedure for the issuance, denial, suspension or revocation of certificates, en-31 rollments and permits.

32(c) Prescribing standards of professional conduct for professional engineers, professional land surveyors, photogrammetrists, engineering interns and land surveying interns. 33

34 (d) Specifying branches of engineering, land surveying and photogrammetric mapping in which 35examinations are offered.

(e) For registering individuals and issuing certificates of registration and temporary permits to 36 37 individuals under ORS 672.002 to 672.325.

38 (f) Prescribing standards and intellectual, educational and technical qualifications for examination, registration and renewal in addition to the qualifications and conditions prescribed in ORS 39 672.105, 672.118, 672.123 and 672.170 and section 2 of this 2013 Act. 40

(g) Prescribing standards and guidelines for retired or inactive status of registrants, including 41 provisions to allow the return to active status. 42

(h) Defining the scope of practice for individuals holding a certificate issued by the board to 43 practice engineering, land surveying or photogrammetric mapping or a temporary permit issued by 44 the board to perform engineering or photogrammetric mapping. 45

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(2) In adopting rules under subsection (1)(c) to (h) of this section, the board shall give consid eration to national practices as well as to local practices. Adoption of rules shall be in accordance
with ORS chapter 183.
<u>SECTION 12.</u> Section 2 of this 2013 Act applies to applications pending or filed with the
State Board of Examiners for Engineering and Land Surveying on or after the effective date

6 of this 2013 Act.

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
