SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Increases amount of service and user charges collected for solid waste disposal that may be set aside by local governments for certain uses.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to disposal sites; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 459.284.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 459.284 is amended to read:

 $\mathbf{5}$ 459.284. Each local government unit that has a disposal site operating under the provisions of 6 ORS 459.005 to 459.437 and 459.710 and for which the local government unit collects a fee may ap-7 portion an amount of the service or user charges collected for solid waste disposal at each publicly 8 owned, franchised or privately owned solid waste disposal site within or for the local government 9 unit and dedicate and use the moneys obtained for rehabilitation and enhancement of the area 10 around the disposal site from which the fees have been collected. That portion of the service and 11 user charges set aside by the local government unit for the purposes of this section [shall be] may 12not **be** more than [\$1] **\$10** for each ton of solid waste. If any local government unit apportions moneys under this section, another local government unit may not also apportion moneys under this 13 14 section for the same disposal site.

15 <u>SECTION 2.</u> The amendments to ORS 459.284 by section 1 of this 2013 Act apply to 16 charges collected under ORS 459.284 on or after the effective date of this 2013 Act.
