SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Directs Oregon Health Authority to [adopt rules] conduct study on feasibility of requiring all infants born in this state to be screened for lysosomal storage disorders.

Requires authority to report results to Legislative Assembly by March 1, 2015.

[Declares emergency, effective on passage.]

2	Relating to infant screening.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section, "lysosomal storage disorder" means Krabbe dis-
5	ease, Pompe disease, Gaucher disease, Fabry disease, Niemann-Pick disease or any other in-
6	herited metabolic disorder resulting from a defect in lysosomal functionality.
7	(2) The Oregon Health Authority shall conduct a study related to infants who have a
8	lysosomal storage disorder and assess the feasibility of requiring infants born in this state
9	to be screened and treated for lysosomal storage disorders. The authority shall report the
10	results of the study to the Legislative Assembly, in the manner provided for in ORS 192.245,
11	on or before March 1, 2015.
12	SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2013 Act is repealed on March 2, 2015.
