

## HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 33

By COMMITTEE ON VETERANS' SERVICES AND EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

May 31

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after the semicolon insert “creating new provisions;” and  
2 after “401.054” insert “; and declaring an emergency”.

3 On page 2, after line 15, insert:

4 **“SECTION 2. (1) The Task Force on Resilience Plan Implementation is established, con-**  
5 **sisting of the following members:**

6 **“(a) Two members from among members of the Senate appointed by the President of the**  
7 **Senate.**

8 **“(b) Two members from among members of the House of Representatives appointed by**  
9 **the Speaker of the House of Representatives.**

10 **“(c) Eight members appointed by the Governor as follows:**

11 **“(A) One advisor of the Governor on public safety.**

12 **“(B) One advisor of the Governor on regional solutions.**

13 **“(C) One individual recommended by the Association of Oregon Counties.**

14 **“(D) One individual recommended by the League of Oregon Cities.**

15 **“(E) One individual recommended by the Special Districts Association of Oregon.**

16 **“(F) One individual representing the scientific community.**

17 **“(G) One individual representing the private business sector.**

18 **“(H) One individual representing the private nonprofit sector.**

19 **“(d) The Adjutant General, or an individual designated by the Adjutant General.**

20 **“(e) The Director of the Office of Emergency Management or an officer or employee of**  
21 **the office designated by the director.**

22 **“(f) The chairperson of the Seismic Safety Policy Advisory Commission or a member of**  
23 **the commission designated by the chairperson.**

24 **“(g) The Director of Transportation or another officer or employee of the Department**  
25 **of Transportation designated by the director.**

26 **“(h) The Public Health Director appointed by the Director of the Oregon Health Author-**  
27 **ity under ORS 431.035 or another officer or employee of the authority.**

28 **“(2) The Governor shall select one of the members of the task force to serve as chair-**  
29 **person and one member to serve as vice chairperson.**

30 **“(3) The task force shall facilitate a comprehensive and robust plan to implement the**  
31 **strategic vision and roadmap of the Oregon Resilience Plan for responding to the conse-**  
32 **quences of naturally occurring seismic events associated with geologic shift along the**  
33 **Cascadia subduction zone by making recommendations about:**

34 **“(a) Education and training of community leaders in emergency management and**  
35 **resilience practices, including:**

1       “(A) The development of programs required to significantly improve emergency manage-  
2       ment knowledge and skills within public, private and private-nonprofit leadership throughout  
3       the State of Oregon.

4       “(B) The establishment of integrated curriculum to facilitate emergency management  
5       best practices throughout the region that are supported by the Federal Emergency Manage-  
6       ment Agency.

7       “(C) The expansion of outreach and professional development opportunities for emer-  
8       gency management agencies.

9       “(D) The implementation of a sustainable structure for education and training necessary  
10      to facilitate statewide resilience awareness, investment and preparedness.

11      “(E) The establishment of a permanent center of excellence in the State of Oregon for  
12      resilience initiatives and research.

13      “(F) The provision of regular updates on emerging education and training programming  
14      opportunities.

15      “(b) Coordination of investments in equipment, facilities and systems critical for en-  
16      hanced resilience and survivability in the near, intermediate and far terms, including:

17      “(A) The facilitation of near-term, intermediate-term, and far-term strategic investments  
18      of talent, time and moneys in support of established resilience strategies.

19      “(B) The implementation of structured, systemic and timely outreach programming tar-  
20      geting public, private and private-nonprofit stakeholders.

21      “(C) The implementation of targeted public enhancements of critical facilities associated  
22      with emergency response, public safety regeneration and civic restoration standards.

23      “(D) The prioritization of state expenditures, including the use of moneys in the Educa-  
24      tion Seismic Fund established in ORS 286A.768 and the Emergency Services Seismic Fund  
25      established in ORS 286A.788.

26      “(E) Analysis of international, national and state best practices.

27      “(F) The standardization of education and training programming.

28      “(4) The chairperson, or the vice chairperson acting in place of the chairperson:

29      “(a) Shall establish an agenda for the task force.

30      “(b) Shall provide leadership and direction to the task force.

31      “(c) May establish subcommittees as necessary and may appoint individuals who are not  
32      members of the task force as members of a subcommittee.

33      “(5) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the  
34      transaction of business.

35      “(6) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the voting  
36      members of the task force.

37      “(7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appoint-  
38      ment to become immediately effective.

39      “(8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson  
40      or of a majority of the voting members of the task force.

41      “(9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.

42      “(10) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided in ORS 192.245, which  
43      may include recommendations for legislation, to the Seventy-seventh Legislative Assembly  
44      on or before October 1, 2014.

45      “(11) The Oregon Military Department shall provide staff support to the task force.

1           “(12) Members of the task force are not entitled to compensation, but may be reimbursed  
2 for actual and necessary travel and other expenses incurred by them in the performance of  
3 their official duties in the manner and amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. Claims for ex-  
4 penses must be paid out of funds appropriated to Oregon Military Department for purposes  
5 of the task force.

6           “(13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist  
7 the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating  
8 to confidentiality, to furnish information and advice the members of the task force consider  
9 necessary to perform their duties.

10          “SECTION 3. Section 2 of this 2013 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the  
11 2015 regular session of the Legislative Assembly as specified in ORS 171.010.

12          “SECTION 4. The amendments to ORS 401.054 by section 1 of this 2013 Act become op-  
13 erative on January 1, 2014.

14          “SECTION 5. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public  
15 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect  
16 on its passage.”

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
