SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Reconciles statutes relating to nonprofit or charitable organization auction or raffle of alcoholic liquor.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

1	A BILL FOR AN ACT
2	Relating to the sale of alcoholic liquor by noncommercial organizations; amending ORS 471.408; and

declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. ORS 471.408 is amended to read:

- 471.408. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, alcoholic liquor may not be given as a prize, premium or consideration for a lottery, contest, game of chance or skill, or competition of any kind.
- [(2) A charitable, nonprofit corporation may conduct raffles for wine and arrange for delivery of the wine to the residence of the person winning a raffle.]
- (2) A nonprofit or charitable organization registered in this state may auction or raffle alcoholic liquor as provided under ORS 471.162 (6) and may deliver or arrange for delivery of the alcoholic liquor to the residence of the successful bidder or raffle winner.
- (3) A charitable, fraternal or religious organization may offer alcoholic liquor as a prize, premium or consideration in a contest of chance described in ORS 167.117 (7)(b) or conducted as part of a Monte Carlo event as defined in ORS 167.117.
- (4) An auction is not a lottery, contest, game of chance or skill or competition for purposes of this section.
- SECTION 2. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect on its passage.
